 The cause of many of the diseases, and dental troubles, heretofore ascribed as constitutional, have been traced directly to the teeth. Biting, drooling, frothing, loss of flesh, weak eyes, driving on one side, and millinery very peculiar to diseased and irregular teeth. Rough edges and sharp corners of the teeth irritate the mouth, and produce nervousness and irritability, unclean and elongated molars and incisors prevent the proper mastication of the food, producing indigestion and general ill-health. Puffed and swollen corners of the nose, abscesses, nasal discharges, etc. These causes should be removed. Decayed teeth should be removed by root, or, if in position, sharp corners and edges should be smoothed down, and elongated and uneven molars and incisors cut off. The common feat, or the habit of not brushing the teeth to accomplish this, will not suffice but special instruments devised for the purpose are necessary.

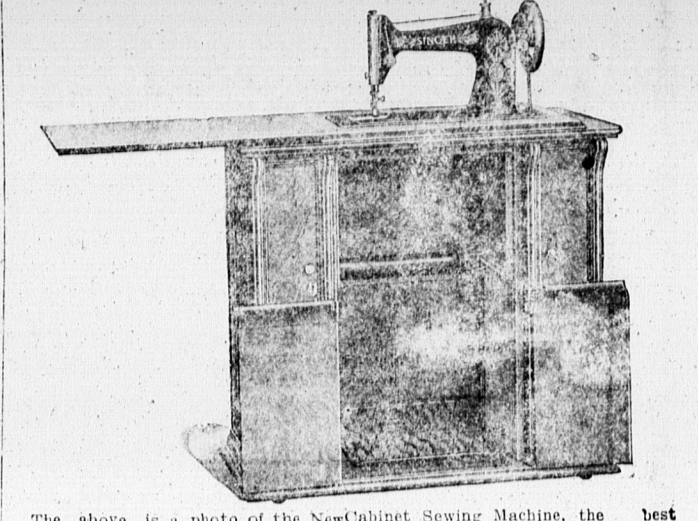

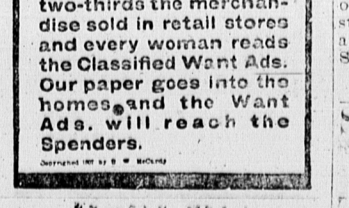

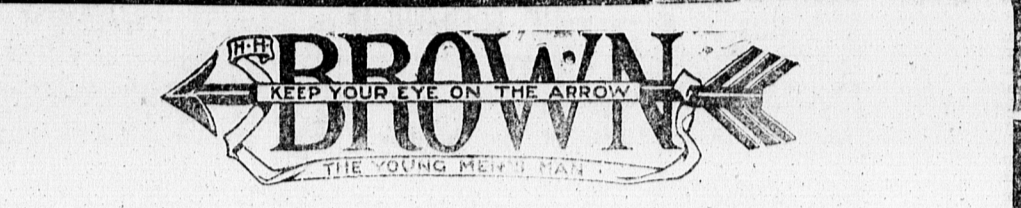
