CALGARY'S POPULATION

CALGARY, Alta., Nov. 18.—That the population of the city of Calgary is now 90,324 is the estimate of a directory company which has just issued a new book on this city. The book contains 57,349 names and by using the multiple 1.75 which is stated to be a very conservative one, the population is stated to be 90,324.

IN GRAPE TIME

A way to keep grapes fresh until Christmas: Dip the stems in melted paraffin, and then wrap each bunch in tissue paper, twisting it firmly to keep out the air, and packing the grapes in layers in a basket with sheet wadding between each layer.

To make grape catsup wash, cook, and strain three quarts of Concord grapes; add two pounds of sugar, one pint of vinegar, two tablespoons each of cloves, allspice, and cinnamon, half a teaspoonful of cayenne pepper, and one teaspoonful of salt; boil the catsup twenty minutes and bottle it.

The following is a good recipe for grape jelly: Pick over, wash, and remove stems from the grapes. Put into a preserving kettle, heat to boiling point, mash, and allow to boil for 25 minutes. Strain through a coarse strainer and then allow the juice to drop through a double thickness of cheesecloth or a jelly bag. Measure, bring to the boiling point, and let boil five minutes. Add an equal amount of heated sugar, boil the mixture, skin and pour into jelly glasses. Place in a sunny window, and let stand for 24 hours. Cover, and keep in a cool dry place.

FEWER TRADE DISPUTES AND WORKING DAYS LOST

The Department of Labour reports that the industrial situation from the standpoint of the number of trade disputes in existence, was better in October than at any time during the year. The loss of time to employes through trade disputes actually commencing during that month was small, and in all there were only eight disputes in existence, this number including those already in existence at the beginning of the month and those which commenced during October. On no occasion during the present year has the number been as small as this; the next best record being in September when eleven disputes were reported. About 3,657 employes were directly, and indirectly involved in the disputes of the month. About 70,000 working days were lost through strikes and lockouts during October as compared with 83,380 during September and 98,000 in October, 1912. As in the previous months the most important dispute was that of coal miners on Vancouver Island. It is difficult to estimate the loss of time through this dispute, as it is probable that the strikers obtain work from time to time in other localities and that other men are taken on by the operators concerned. An estimate would show about 2,000 men out of work directly as a result of this dispute during October.

FATAL BLOW FROM AUTOMOBILE

NEW YORK, November 18—Rev. Dr. James Ross, a leading scholar and educator of Canada, was struck and fatally injured by an automobile in a city street late today. He died from a fractured skull an hour later. He had stepped from behind a trolley car into the path of the automobile.

CANADA'S PEAT INDUSTRY

"Canada's peat industry has become an economic factor of commercial importance. It has passed beyond the experimental stage and is now on a basis for extensive development," writes J. G. Adams, B.A., in this week's issue of the Journal of Commerce, Montreal in an illustrated article on Canada's Peat Industry. Continuing the writer shows that last year Canada imported over fourteen and a half million tons of coal valued at nearly \$40,000,000 or a per capita expenditure for this one import alone of over \$6.00. In Canada already over 40,000 acres of peat bog have been surveyed and explored "but there is an almost incalculable amount of peat between the Atlantic and the Pacific, much of it still unknown. Over this area the peat averages possibly 20 feet in depth and when it is remembered that one acre of peat one foot deep will yield approximately 250 tons or that an acre 20 feet deep will yield 5000 tons one may understand, in some small degree, the importance and value of this almost unlimited supply of fuel."

TENDERS ARE TO BE OPEN TOMORROW

OTTAWA, November 18—Tenders were received at the department of railways and canals today for section five of the new Welland ship canal. This is the section extending from Allenburg to Port Robinson, and will be the fourth to be placed under contract. Chief Engineer Wellner, in charge of the canal construction, was here today in connection with the tenders. The contract will be let shortly.

DEAD BABE REVIVES AS COFFIN CLOSING

The funeral service had been said and the undertaker was getting ready to screw down the lid of the casket in which three-year-old Marie Hesse, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Henry Hesse, who live on a ranch near Wray Colo., was lying supposedly dead, when a neighbor noticed that the ends of her ears were pink. The funeral was stopped, and the girl is still alive, although still unconscious. The child had been ill, for several days and following a fit of convulsions she lapsed into unconsciousness. She apparently had ceased to breathe, and a condition resembling rigor mortis set in. The doctor in attendance made several tests of heart and lung tests and declared the child dead. The parents refused to have the body embalmed. The child was removed from the casket and placed in bed, where restoratives were applied. The physicians believe she will recover.

FERTILIZER FROM THE AIR

It is sixty years since St. Clair Deville first showed how aluminum could be extracted at a cost of \$120 a pound. But he declared his belief that new and cheaper methods would be developed, and there would come a day when aluminum factories would produce fertilizers.

The first part of the prediction has already come true; the price has fallen from \$6 a pound in 1888 to twenty cents today. The other prediction seems to have been made true by an Austrian chemist named Serpuk.

The commonest source of aluminum is bauxite, a red earth of which the most important deposits are in France, though it is found elsewhere. By the Serpuk method the bauxite is heated to something like 2,700 degrees in the presence of carbon, when it combines with the nitrogen of the air to form salts that can be easily reduced to metallic aluminum and ammonium sulphate.

And ammonium sulphate is the foundation of valuable fertilizers, for it supplies the nitrogen so hard to obtain for plant food. Incidentally, this process is said to make it possible to produce aluminum for ten cents a pound. But as it is covered by patents that may not help the consumer.

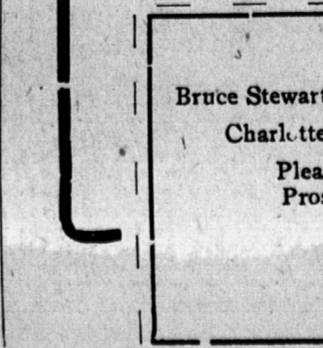
