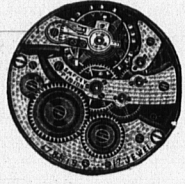

REGARDING HOGS

To the Farmers. Gentlemen: We wish to call your attention to our advertisement for hogs, intimating that we will start receiving those Sept. 7th, and suggesting that as many as possible be ready early. This is greatly to your advantage, as there are very few hogs marketed here in early spring, and practically speaking none during June, July, August. We are three months without securing any stock and it is important that we have goods to supply customers, or else they go to western packers and it is very difficult to secure them again. This was the case last fall when few hogs were sold until December—after the customers in Nova Scotia and New Brunswick had bought their supplies elsewhere, necessitating our carrying this stock until the spring and summer—at a serious cost of interest, depreciation, etc., as well as losing the trade last fall. Again, when stocks are light in September and October the price is general at the highest, and we have been trying to encourage the producer of quality, or encouraging the man who produces what the market demands. And while there are men who complain of our methods (which by the way, is what the Government and Egg Circle people are at, considering the cost of attempting to force business), yet we feel that improvement is being made, and we appreciate the co-operation of those who are making efforts to supply hogs of the desired weight, and we still continue to pay an advanced price for all hogs from 120 to 180 lbs. dressed weight. We have paid more for those than for heavier ones, simply because we can sell the meats at higher prices. In doing this we have been trying to encourage the "Production of Quality", or encouraging the man who produces what the market demands. 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
