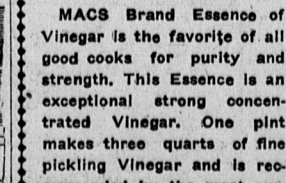

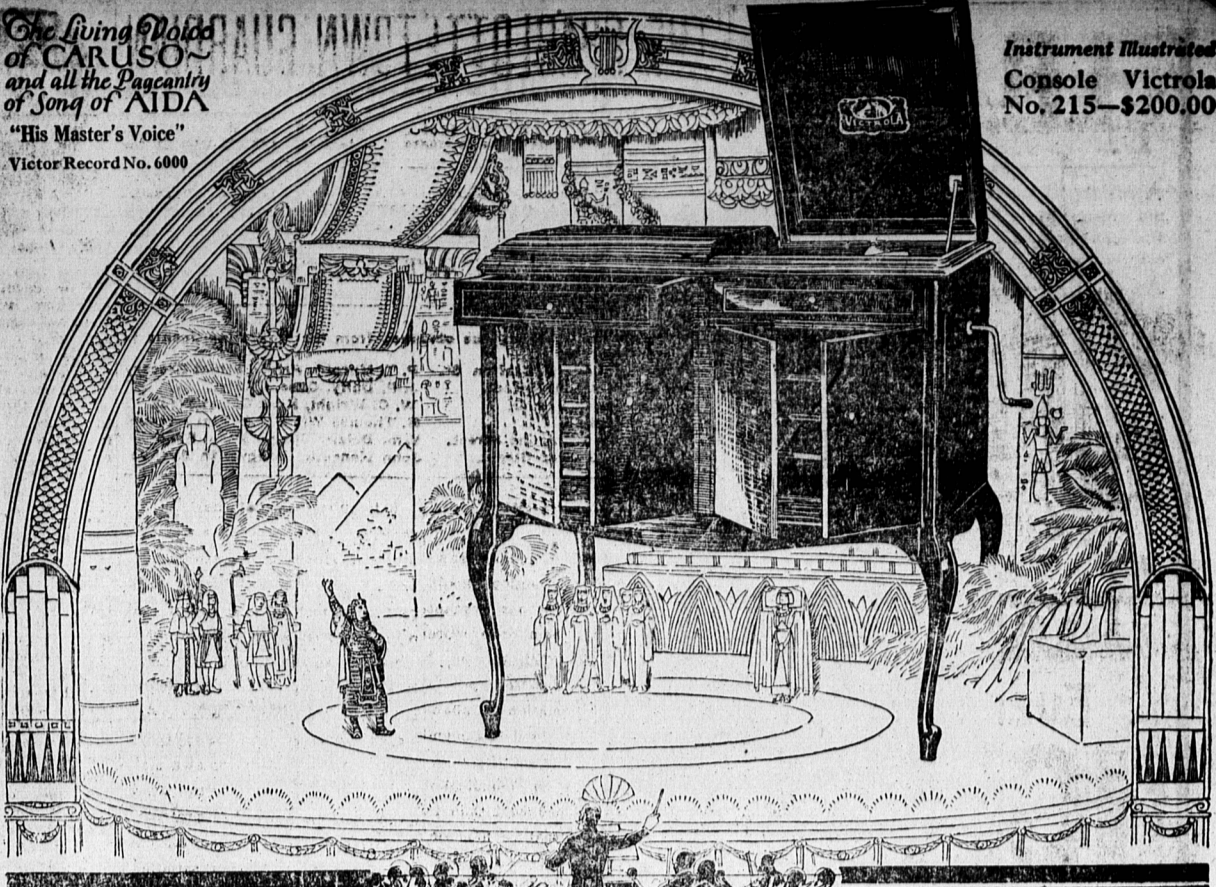

 LONDON, Oct. 13.—Referring to recent note on "snake-charming" and to the curious quality which some of the natives appear to possess, of attracting and doming wild animals, a correspondent in The Times relates the following incident:—
 "We were staying for a few days with the Collector in a tiny place thirty miles from Madras. Just as a native as the snake-charmer arrived and asked to be allowed to do several ordinary tricks. The Collector said: 'No; the Sahib-log had seen them all.' Then the native asked if he should call the crows. 'Certainly,' said the collector; 'there are none here.' For eight or nine minutes there was a curious whistling and calling, and then the birds began to come, first in twos and threes, then more and more, till the place was black with crows. The charmer asked if this was enough, or should he call more crows. We said 'Bus' (it is enough). 'Now send them away again.' And he did. In a few minutes not a crow was in sight. The performance was well worth five rupees. Even our host had not seen this particular 'turn' before."
