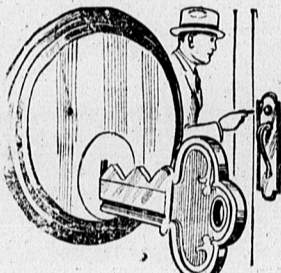

"O-a Enns," she said.

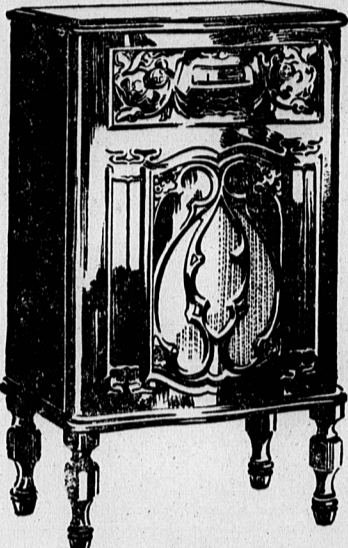
"Exactly," said the doctor; "Josiah Haines."

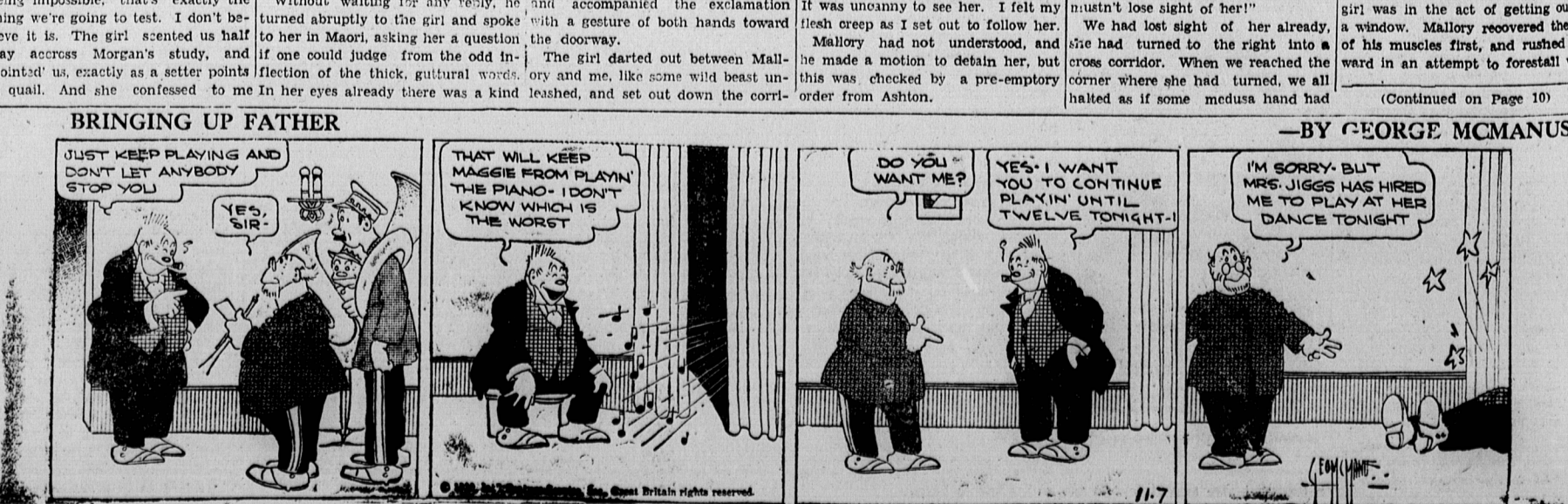
