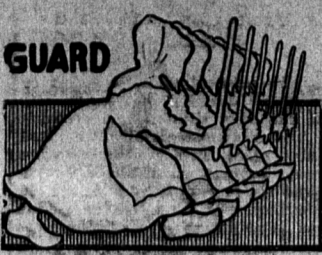

PRINCE KATSURA'S BRAIN VERY BIG

TOKIO, Nov. 19, (Special)—The brain of the late Prince Katsura, one of Japan's greatest statesmen, who died October 10, weighed slightly more than 1,600 grammes (56 1/2 ounces). Prince Katsura was president of the Japanese society devoted to the study of cancer, from which disease he died, and in accordance with his own directions, the body was offered to science and dissected. This brain weight is said to be nearly the same as that of Kant, the German philosopher, and heavier than that of Napoleon III. and Gambetta. It was a little lighter than that of Bismarck and about three hundred grammes (10 1/2 ounces) heavier than the brain of an average person.

The post-mortem examination was conducted under the historic Japanese ceremony. When all preparations had been completed, Dr. Nagayo, a celebrated surgeon, surrounded by a number of physicians, addressed the spirit of the departed Prince, saying that in accordance with the dead man's own wishes he was about to dissect certain parts of the body for the benefit of science. After the operation the surgeon again addressed the spirit of the deceased, reporting the completion of the task and expressing gratitude for the benefit which science would receive. Princess Katsura, who had heroically remained throughout, then approached the body, uttered a brief prayer to her husband's spirit and murmured that in accordance with his wishes she had requested the direction in the interest of science. The examination proved that the Prince was suffering from cancer which originated in the stomach and spread to the liver. The fact that Prince Katsura had desired dissection was made public by the Princess who insisted that the examination should be made. Her fortitude has created a profound impression throughout the empire. President Wilson took occasion to manifest the sympathy of America to the family of Prince Katsura and to the people of Japan by sending a beautiful wreath through Mr. George W. Guthrie, the United States Ambassador. The wreath was conspicuously placed beside that offered by the Empress Dowager of Japan.

HALIFAX CHURCHES TO BE UNITED

HALIFAX, Nov. 17.—Rev. Robert Johnston, minister of St. Andrew's Presbyterian church, announced to his congregation at yesterday's afternoon service, that a call was likely to be extended him, and at Park street Presbyterian church a notice was read that the adjoining meeting to consider the extending of a call would be held on Wednesday evening after the weekly prayer meeting.

No names were mentioned, but it is known that the intention is to call Rev. Robert Johnston. There is no doubt that this will be the outcome and it is said that the Park street people will be unanimous for Mr. Johnston. This probably means a great deal more than the calling by one church of the minister of another. It means the union of two Presbyterian churches in Halifax—that, instead of the congregations of Chalmers church, Coburg road, and St. Andrew's Tobin street, there will be but one, and that will be on the site of the present Chalmers church. The indications are that ere long the two churches will be united under the name of St. Andrew's church, Coburg road.

At the close of the service in St. Andrew's yesterday morning a conference of the session and managers was held, when the situation was explained. Mr. Johnston repeated the statement that a call to him was likely, but the name of the wooing church was not mentioned, though all present knew the movement that is afoot. It was taken for granted that Mr. Johnston would accept and that there would consequently be a vacancy in St. Andrew's.

ANOTHER MYSTERY OF THE SEA SOLVED

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 17.—Another mystery of the sea is thought to have been solved in a story brought to this port yesterday of the discovery of the British ship Marlborough, which has been missing for twenty-four years. The ship, aground on the rocks, and skeletons of her crew of thirty men have been found in a cove near Punta Arenas, Patagonia. Evidence pointed to a fight with natives who, after murdering the crew, despoiled the vessel of its cargo.

The human bones, scattered cutlasses and disordered decks, told the story of massacre. The ship's log was not decipherable.

The story was brought by the master of a sailing vessel who sighted the Marlborough and boarded her enroute to this port.

STEAMER WYOMING AND BARGE FOUNDERED

PORT HURON, Mich., Nov. 17.—The steamer Wyoming and barge probably foundered in the gale a week ago Sunday on Lake Huron. The Wyoming passed this port up-bound, at 5.30 o'clock on the morning of November 7. It is thought she was near Saginaw Bay, when the storm struck her. The Wyoming and barge had a crew of 23. She was a wooden steamer.

C.N.R. SAILINGS ONLY TEMPORARY TO ST. JOHN

MONTREAL, Nov. 16.—The Canadian Northern mail steamers are being advertised in the railway stations here as sailings between Halifax and Bristol this winter. Yesterday's Montreal Mail printed the following: "It is definitely settled that the Royal steamships will sail to and from St. John instead of Halifax this winter," said R. C. Vaughan, assistant to D. B. Hanna, third vice-president of the Canadian Northern Railway, while in Montreal yesterday. "But that arrangement is only temporary. Next year we will be back at Halifax again."

ACADIA MINE'S LOWER SHAFTS CLOSED

WESTVILLE, November 17.—The lower shafts of the Acadia mine have been closed. The Acadia Coal company has chartered a special car for the accommodation of those who have been thrown out of work by this change, to the Albion mine, where there are places for all the men.
