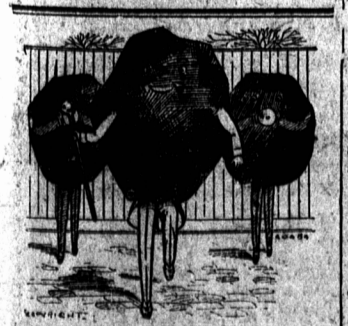

IN MEMORIAM

MRS. JACOB LING.

A gloom was cast over New Glasgow last Wednesday, April 1, when it was learned that Mrs. Jacob Ling passed away very suddenly that morning. She had been in fairly good health all winter, and her going out was entirely unexpected. On March 22 she passed her seventy-third birthday, and on January 18 her forty-fourth wedding anniversary. It is the first break in this family of husband and wife and six children, and naturally, is felt very keenly. Of her two sons, Horace, with his wife, lives at home, and Herbert, who is also married, lives in Salem, Massachusetts. The eldest daughter, Ella (Mrs. Albert A. Walker) is in Auburn, Maine, as is also Nettie (Mrs. Joseph Hearn). Miss Elizabeth is training for a nurse at the Cambridge Hospital, and Harriet, the youngest of the family has for a number of years been living in Newton, Massachusetts. Mrs. Ling had five brothers and three sisters but only Charles Sellar of this city survives. Within two hours after the receipt of a message of their mother's death was received, all of the absent children except one were on their way home to attend the funeral which was held on Saturday at the Christian Church of which the deceased was a devoted member for nearly forty years. She resided in the fact that her husband and all of her children were members of the church too.

The funeral was very largely attended; the church was crowded and the floral tributes many. Rev. C. A. Haight, her pastor, conducted the service.
