The Stanley made the round trip to Cape Tormentine Saturday reaching Tormentine at 9.30 a. m. and returning to Summerside at 2.40 p. m. There were 13 passengers, 70 packages freight and 40 bags bait going, and five passengers and 185 packages freight coming. No mail was brought this way although a special train left Sackville in the morning and connected with the steamer. The Tormentine special left on return about 10 a. m. in time to connect with the C. P. R. at Sackville. A special train from Charlottetown connected with the Stanley here in the morning and afternoon leaving here on return to the city at 3.15 p. m.

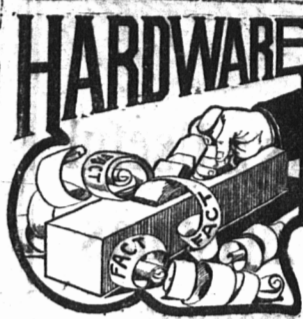
