DEATH OF JOHN HARRISON.

At Kirby Stephen, Westmoreland Co., England, on Sabbath, April 21, John Harrison, brother of Rev. William Harrison, Charlottetown, passed away at the age of 72 years. For several years Mr. Harrison served his fellowtown's men well as a member of the Parish Council while in Educational work, which was especially congenial to him, he played a useful part on the School Board. For some years he was Chairman of the Board of Council of School Managers, in Church matters, Mr. Harrison was associated all his life with the Wesleyan Church and exercised a strong influence in the counsels and activities of the church. During the early part of his career his chief interest centered in the Sunday Schools where he labored for some 30 years as Superintendent. Local Methodism also profited much by his able services as Chapel Trustee, local preacher, class leader and circuit official. He was a life-abstainer and warm supporter of the temperance movement taking a special interest in the Band of Hope.—Wesleyan.

NEW FIVE DOLLAR BILL.

A change in Canada's currency which is of more consequence than the gold currency is the institution of a new \$5 Government note. Authority for the issue of this note was given recently in parliament; and despatches from Ottawa state that it will soon be ready. The denominations of Government notes in active use are \$1, 2, \$4, \$500, \$1,000 \$5,000. Last year and in 1910, when the note circulations of the chartered banks were pressed closely upon the authorized limits, and the Western wheat crop was coming on the market, the banks were obliged to circulate a considerable amount of Dominion Government "fours" and United States paper money. It is the recurrence of a situation of that kind that the new \$5 Government bills are designed to meet.

THE MAGIC OF A SIPHON.

When a pipe shaped like the inverted letter U, in which the arms are of equal length, is filled with water, and each end of the pipe is put into a separate vessel full of water, "the downward pull," or weight, of the liquid in each of the two arms will balance the other, and, if the water is at the same level in both vessels. But if the level of the water in one vessel is lower than in the other, since the two vessels are connected with

a pipe full of water, the water will run down from the higher level to the lower.
