An order-in-council has been passed prohibiting oyster fishing on the beds in Townal, Orwell and North Rivers, Prince Edward Island, for two years from September 30, 1910, and in Bedeque Bay for three years. It is also to be prohibited in the beds of Vernon and Seal Rivers for two years from September, 1912.

A Sydney paper, in its write-up of the Exhibition there, had the following to say of a firm whose members are natives of this city:—An interesting exhibit was that of Pinaud Bros., the Westmount boat builders, whose booth was the centre of attraction for all lovers of yachting and boating generally. McGrath, the secretary, to read the minutes of the services meeting. These stood as approved. He then called on B. Howatt to open the affirmative side of the Debate, which was "Resolved that cheap moving picture shows are beneficial to a town and country." Mr. Howatt was supported by Miss M. Goff, E. Warburton and A. McDonald. The speakers on the negative were E. Peters, Miss L. Bene, H. Johnson and S. Hines. When the regular speakers had finished Mr. McLaughlan called on A. Paoli, who supported the resolution in a short speech. The President then called on M. McKinnon who opposed the resolution. Mr. Peters then closed the negative side and Mr. Howatt the affirmative. The resolution was then put to vote, and defeated by a large majority. Miss M. McDonald was critic. She said the order of the whole was good but there had been some needless repetition in the course of some of the speeches.

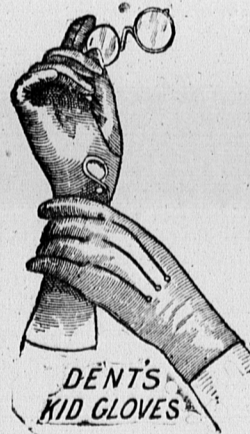
