Alberton Film Council Plans Busy Schedule

—Since its organization the Alberton Film Council have been very active and is proving a real benefit to both the town and surrounding districts. The committee in charge are giving much of their time without any remuneration, to make a success of the council, and they are deserving of the earnest support of all the citizens, especially those with school going children. Mr. Clarke, the energetic president, is assuming a large part of the burden in this community enterprise. He is the custodian of the projector and arranges for nearly all of the film screenings. On many occasions he does the operating of the machine himself. The idea behind a film council, which is a worthy one, is educational, its purpose is to make available to schools, churches and adult organizations, films of an informative nature for screening to those groups. Practically every phase of world activity is covered in those films and they have been of incalculable benefit in both the schoolroom and at the adult group meetings. Alberton and the nearby districts are very fortunate in having a Film Council, which was the first on the Island, to provide them with this excellent film service. At the present time this service is free to any group or school that wishes to take advantage of it. The Council is equipped with a generator which makes possible the showing of those films in places without electricity. At a recent meeting of the Film Council it was moved and seconded that the Alberton local Film Council purchase the projector, therefore every school and adult group should avail themselves of the opportunity to contribute a fair share towards this worthy cause.—D.

Annual Meeting West Prince Exhibition Assoc.

Chairmen of different committees were re-appointed. Directors returned to meeting with Mr. Lester Wallace now presiding. It was decided to hold 1950 exhibition on the first Wednesday in September. Next meeting of the Association will be held in March, date to be set by president and secretary. At that meeting prize list will be gone over.
