NEW YORK, Nov. 22--(AP)--The stock market got a good start on the rallying side today. Losers in the Canadian section included Power Corporation, Shawinigan, Massey Harris, Imperial Tobacco, Imperial Oil and Brazilian Traction. Distillers Seagram, Dome and Lake Shore Mines and International Nickel advanced trifles. The Associated Press average finished off 1 of a point at 44.5 after being up as much as noon. Transfers totalled 714,050 shares compared with 814,760 Wednesday. Portions of their morning upturn were retained by U. S. Steel, Bethlehem, Youngstown Sheet, General Motors, Yellow Truck, Stara Roebuck, Douglas Aircraft, Great Northern, American Telephone, American Smelting, U. S. Rubber preferred, Paramount, Warner Bros., International Paper, common and preferred and Certain-Teed preferred. American Can dropped 3 points to a new 1940 bottom and declines of 1 to 2 or so were shown for Dow Chemical, Du Pont, Allied Chemical, Johns-Manville and Eastman Kodak. Lesser losers were Montgomery Ward, N.Y. Central, Standard Oil of N.J., General Electric, Chesapeake and Ohio and United Aircraft.
