C. M. B. A. BUSINESS. G. V. McInerney K. C., returned on Saturday from Kingston, Ont., where, in the capacity of grand trustee, he had been attending a meeting of the grand council of the C. M. B. A. Business of considerable importance was transacted. The head office was moved from London, Ont., to Kingston, J. J. Baker, grand trustee, was appointed grand secretary and his place as grand trustee was filled by the appointing of Lynch Stanton, K. C., of Hamilton, Ont.
