RUSSIAN PATRIARCH DIES IN PRISON

RIGA, June 17.—According to statements printed in the newspapers here Archbishop Tikhon, former Patriarch of all Russia, died in prison June 16th. The Baltic newspaper advices charge that Archbishop Tikhon died from poisoning. No confirmation is obtainable.

June 16 is the date given in Moscow dispatches as that on which the Patriarch addressed a letter to the supreme court adjuring anti-Soviet tendencies. The Moscow Soviet officials say he has since been released but do not reveal his whereabouts.
