STANDING OF CADETS.—Lt. Col. H. D. Johnson, R. O. Secretary of the Local Committee of the Strathcona Trust, Charlottetown, has received from Major W. B. Outhit, Inspector of Cadets, the following report showing the relative standing of those cadet corps in Prince Edward Island connected with public schools: 1st—Prince of Wales College—Instructor, Lt. J. A. Murphy, 77 per cent. 2nd—West Kent Street School—Instructor Capt. A. R. B. Duce, 75 per cent. 3rd—Queen Square School—Instructor, Lt. Jas. Landrigan, 73 per cent. Next in order came Summerside High School—Mr. E. E. Strong, Instructor. Montague School—Lt. G. H. Campbell, Instructor. Tignish School—Lt. L. Nelligan, Instructor. Souris School—Lt. E. D. Feehan, Instructor. Alberton School, Lt. M. E. Francis, Instructor. In addition to the above St. Dunstan's College Cadet Corps, which is outside the provisions of the Trust, also passed inspection.

AGRICULTURAL PICNIC.—The Agricultural Picnic held on Saturday afternoon at Winsloe North under the auspices of the King Edward Institute was a grand success. Between 250 and 300 were in attendance and ample preparation had been made for the Live Stock Judging classes and also for the ladies part of the program. Nine cattle in all were brought in for the class in dairy cattle, all above average and most of them of excellent quality. Robert Robertson of the Provincial Department of Agriculture went carefully over one cow pointing out what was looked for in good dairy conformation and then asked individuals to place the cows in order of merit. This brought out a lot of discussion which was of a most interesting and instructive character. Professor Ross, Secretary for Agriculture, then spoke for a few minutes on the work of the Department, and congratulated the King Edward Institute on their excellent program. Mr. Robertson then took up a class of heavy horses, but as it was then quite late in the afternoon, there was not time to go into the subject in detail. While the men were being entertained at the judging classes Miss James was organizing a Women's Institute and arranging for future work. Mr. Benson also addressed the ladies on the better caring for and marketing of eggs and Prof. Ross on the work that might be done through Women's Institutes. Luncheon had been served and a lot of discussion of the work done took place. Everyone was satisfied that a most profitable and interesting afternoon had been spent, and when the time comes round next year for an agricultural picnic, big things will be doing. The ladies are to be particularly congratulated for the energy and zeal with which they carried out their part of the program. This week Mr. Robertson will conduct Live Stock Judging classes as follows: Monday July 7th at St. Georges, Tuesday at the farm of T. J. Wigginton, Bridgetown, Wednesday at Bay Fortune, Thursday Rollo Bay and Friday at the farm of John C. McCarthy, Morell River.

CLYDE RIVER.—The Semi-annual examination of Clyde River School, No. 63, was held on Monday, June 30th. There was a large number of visitors present and the pupils were examined in their various studies by Miss Elsie Brown, Mr. Earl Leard, New Haven; Mr. W. W. Crosby, West River; Messrs Randolph Murchison and Edward McPhail, Clyde River; and W. A. MacQuarrie B. A., Hampton; acquitting themselves very creditably indeed. Before the pupils were dismissed, Miss Edna McKinnon on behalf of the scholars presented the pretty bouquet and a handsome real-estate Manicure set, with silver trimmings enclosed in a morocco leather box and Miss Norma Murchison read the following address:—Dear Teacher: We the pupils of Clyde River School wish on this the closing day of the school year to take this opportunity to convey to you our appreciation of your many kindnesses to us during the two years you have been our beloved teacher. 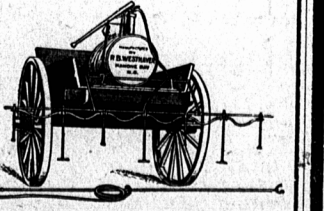

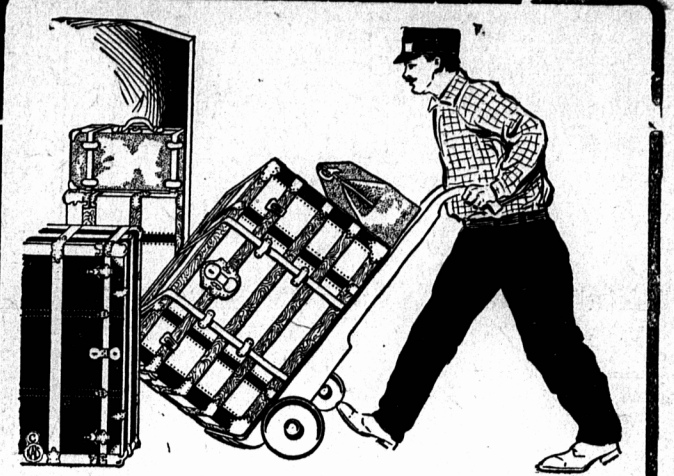
