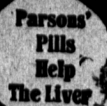

THE HILLSBORO.—The Hillsboro launch running between Charlottetown and Rocky Point is to be launched this forenoon after having undergone extensive repairs by the Department of Public Works. The Hillsboro was built a paddle-boat and ran in 1894 on the Southport ferry until 1906, when the new bridge was opened there. It was then put on the Charlottetown-Rocky Point route. On the first of January, this year, it was hauled up and inspected by the Dominion Inspector of Hulls and has undergone thorough repairs, all the defective parts being taken out and renewed. The bottom has been thoroughly remodelled and re-coppered and the machinery completely overhauled and put in a first class condition. She is now as good as new. The work was carried out by the Department of Public Works, under the supervision of Mr. Charles McGregor. The vessel will be launched this forenoon in the presence of the Hon. Mr. McNeill, Commissioner of Public Works, and Mr. L. B. McMILLAN of the Public Works Department.

Men who have wondered what becomes of the large stocks of hats, caps, and clothing that remain unsold at the close of each season will be interested to learn that a considerable portion of such stock is disposed of in China, where the men are adopting the dress of their Western brothers. ### A VOICELESS CHOIR.

In the Church of St. Ann for Deaf Mutes, New York, hymns are rendered by expressive gestures of hands and arms and the facial play of the vested choir girls who are placed in stalls diagonally in front of the chancel so to be well in view of the entire congregation. One of the younger women acts as a leader of this voiceless choir. She starts the hymns with gestures as graceful as hymns are expressive, and the other members of the choir keep their eyes fixed on her and move in rhythm and time with her. There is, of course, no musical instrument in the church, and the congregation takes no part in the "singing," except by following with appreciative eyes the movements of the choir. Even one who knows nothing of the sign language can almost understand what the choir is singing about, so well does it portray the sentiments of the hymns. Sometimes in the midst of the silent attention of the congregation the child of the deaf mute parents begins to talk aloud, or a deaf man who can speak converses with a visitor, but no one is disturbed by it, since it falls on unhearing ears. The real leader and inspiration of the choir is the curate of St. Ann's, the Rev. John Henry Kessler, who lost his hearing twenty-five years ago, when he was eight years old. He had had considerable experience as a choir boy, and this is helpful to him in teaching his voiceless choir to render the hymns and anthems in the sign language effectively.

### SICK ROOM HELPS.

Fever Drink.—The juice of one lemon, one teaspoon cream of tartar, one pint of water. Sweeten with loaf sugar. Let patient drink freely when thirsty.  
 Mustard Plaster.—When making a mustard plaster use no water whatever, but mix the mustard with the white of egg and spread on linen cloths. Using water blisters the skin. Sage Tea.—Sweetened with honey it is good for sore throat. Use as a gargle, with a small bit of alum dissolved in it.  
 Flaxseed Lemonade.—Four table-spoons flaxseed (whole), one quart boiling water poured over the flaxseed, juice of two lemons, leaving on the peel. Sweeten to taste. Steep three hours in a covered pitcher.
