SWIMS TO THE LIGHT MAKING NEW RECORD

Richards of South Boston Covers Distance in 6 Hours 15 Minutes Beating Rose Pitonof's Time 35 1-2 Minutes

BOSTON, Aug. 8.—The cheers of nearly 100 spectators were mingled with the booming of the fog whistles at Boston Light yesterday when Sam Richards, the great South Boston swimmer, after a wonderful exhibition of speed and endurance, finishing the long grind with a superb spurt in the last time of 6 hours and 15 minutes, breaking the former record, held by Rose Pitonof by 35 1-2 minutes.
Richards used the English over-arm stroke throughout the whole exhausting trip, and the South Boston man's marvellous speed in the first four miles was one of the big factors in the result. He finished the first half mile in 17 minutes and did the next three miles in the remarkable time of 1 hour and 33 minutes, averaging nearly one mile in 30 minutes. He had the great good fortune of passing all three lines of ferries without getting in the wake of the boats, and was interfered with in no way during the entire route.

CHOOSE COURSE WISELY.
Richards kept a straight course in the middle of the inner harbor to a point opposite the New England docks, when he began to veer over toward Castle Island. He passed the island close to the shore and followed a course far to the southeast, keeping close to the shore of Spectacle Island on his way to Long Island Head. He coasted along the Long Island shore for nearly a mile, then made a wide detour to avoid the hidden rocks at this point. Richards then turned his course toward Rainsford Island, still hugging the Long Island shore, and after passing three coal barges, which sheltered him from the strong currents to the west, headed directly for Fort Warren. He was aided by a strong outgoing tide, which carried him along through Blackrock Bay to opposite Hug Light. From thence Richards made a bee line to the light and reached there at 2:38.

DUBOROW FAILS IN ATTEMPT.
Charles B. Duborow of Philadelphia, whose continuous swim from Philadelphia to Chester and return and re-swim in New York Harbor have stamped him as one of the greatest swimmers in the world today, made a great fight to reach the much coveted goal, but the tide turned too soon. He lacked the speed which Richards had, but was the stronger and more powerful of the two. Had he left the bridge at 7 instead of 8:23, and had he had the advantage of favorable conditions such as fell to Richards' lot, there is no question but that the Philadelphian would have reached the Light. He used the trudgeon stroke all the way and buried his head deep into the water with every single stroke. He was the victim of the waves of four ferryboats, and the Prince Arthur and Cape Ann also held him up. He passed Nix's mate in fine condition and was swimming nearly as strong as at the start, but the long struggle between Long Island Head and Fort Warren against adverse currents, a strong head-on wind and lashing white-capped breakers exhausted the mighty Philadelphian and he was finally forced to give up in Blackrock Bay, one-eighth of a mile from Bug Light.

JUST BEFORE ELECTION MILLIONS FOR MONCTON

MONCTON, N. B., Aug. 9.—At last night's meeting of the City Council, Mayor Reilly states that the Trans-continental Railway Commission had decided to construct large divisional yards, round house and machine shops in Moncton and would commence work at once. He said that the immediate expenditure would be in the vicinity of half a million dollars. Arrangements have been made for use of natural gas, and the land has been reserved. Ten or twelve miles of yard track will be laid.

lead at the very start, but Richards, was 35 yards ahead of the Philadelphia. The temperature was 66 degrees and the wind was but little wind. Richards, still using the English over-arm, completed the first half-mile in 17 minutes and was fortunate in passing the north and south ferries while the boats were at dock. He reached T wharf at 8:53, 75 yards in front of Hagan, and leading Duborow by 140 yards.
