Par Takes Another Beating In Hale America Golf

CHICAGO, June 19 (AP)—Mike Turness proved to the golfing world today he isn't travelling on the family name of his six famous brothers—in particular Willie, the 1938 national amateur champion, and Sgt. Jimmie, runner-up for the 1942 P.G.A. title.

The 33-year-old Michael from White Plains, N.Y., who never before came close to winning a major tournament, carved a 66, six under par, today to snatch the lead at the halfway mark of the Hale America National Open Tournament over the links of the Ridgemoor Country Club.

Turness's 66, coupled with his 65 yesterday gave him a 36-hole total of 131-13 under par for the two rounds.

Turness met the challenge of White Plains, N.Y., who shot 68 and 69 to finish at 134-14, a total of 278 strokes behind Turness.
