MAY SET US THINKING.

The splendid battleship Dominion, named in honor of Canada, will presently bring across the Atlantic the remains of our deceased Minister of Marine. This is the first important commission entrusted to the new battleship and the first thought suggested by the action of the Imperial Government is that it is a distinctly friendly and courteous one. It shows the same honor to a deceased Minister of the crown in Canada as would have been shown to a member of the Imperial Cabinet under like circumstances. It shows, moreover, that a change of the party in power in the United Kingdom has made no change of the policy that tends to bind together in the closest bonds all portions of the widely extended British Empire.

Mr. Prefontaine himself, while of French lineage and speech, was an imperialist and a warm friend and advocate of British connection. The honor done to his remains may be read as a courteous and graceful tribute to his attitude upon that question. He had moreover taken a deep interest in preparing the way for Canada to be of assistance to the Mother Country by the creation of a naval reserve force in Canada. Some recognition of this fact may also be supposed to lie behind the honor which is now extended. But there are other considerations which will readily suggest themselves to the patriotic Canadian mind in the same connection. Among them there arises the question whether Canada has done, is doing or intends to do her full duty toward the parent State in the matter of naval defence.

The people of the British Islands number about seven times as many as the people of Canada. They are by no means so well off on the average as the people of Canada. A million of their number may be said to be paupers whom the taxpayers have to support. Other millions live in the depths of poverty. We have almost no paupers in Canada. The people of the United Kingdom are burdened with a national debt of formidable proportions, while our public debt is relatively small. And yet almost the entire burden of the construction, maintenance and operation of the Imperial Navy falls upon the British Isles. Australia contributes a little, Cape Colony and Natal a little, while Canada, greatest and wealthiest of the Colonies contributes nothing and has so far contributed nothing to this object.

We ought to think of these things when a battleship, costing some seven millions of dollars and named in honor of Canada comes to our shores on such a mission. Her first cost represents something like a dollar for each family in the British Isles. The Dominion whose name she carries bears no share of this burden, or of the cost of the scores of other battleships and hundreds of other war-craft, or of the great outlay year by year for their maintenance. It is a good time for the Canadian people to think these matters over. Canada is more prosperous than ever before, with good harvests, busy industries and over \$100 per head of her people on deposit in the banks. We look to the Imperial Navy to defend our ports, our coasts and our commerce if endangered or attacked, precisely as it would defend the coasts, ports and commerce of England, Ireland or Scotland. Under the circumstances we cannot expect this great service to be carried on indefinitely and wholly at the cost of the British people, without a forfeiture of our self-respect.
