monds. East won and, unimpressed by the fact that his opponents had led trumps, continued that suit of his own accord, returning the diamond ten.

This was declarer's undoing. Later, he discarded on the heart king and led the heart jack through East for a ruffing finesse, but West took the queen for the setting trick.

There was no need to play for the heart queen to be in East's hand. Declarer should have cashed three clubs, discarding two spades from dummy, then led a spade and taken the diamond finesse. Even if this finesse lost, South would be on safe ground, since the opponents could not remove more than one trump from dummy.

South's jump to five diamonds was decidedly aggressive, considering his void in partner's heart suit and his own extreme weakness in spades. However, because of the perfect fit of the North-South hands, the final contract was excellent.

West, apparently feeling that an attack on the unbid suit would be futile, laid down the heart ace, despite the heart bid he had heard on his left. South ruffed, and right then and there acquired the fixed idea that the heart queen must be in East's hand, "since West would not have led away from ace-queen of hearts." So, disdainful of the trump finesse, South laid down the ace and queen of dia-
