On Tuesday morning, December 2nd, friends learned with deep regret of the death in the City Hospital of Mrs. Patrick Murray of St. Ann's, Lot 65, in her 64th year. She had been in her usual good health until two days previous to her passing. When she suddenly became gravely ill. Despite the best of medical attention and nursing, it was found necessary to have her removed to the Hospital for further treatment. Following her entrance there on the evening of December 1st, a diagnosis showed that her hours on earth were but few, and she gradually sank, and on the above date, she passed peacefully to her eternal rest, sustained by the last rites of the Church, and mourned by her sorrowing husband and family, and numerous friends and relatives.

She will be remembered in the parish of St. Ann's for her friendliness and hospitality in the home, as well as for her readiness to assist every worthy work for the Church and community. The remains were transferred by motor hearse from the A. A. Hennessy Funeral Home in Charlottetown to the late home of the deceased, where numerous friends came to pay their last tribute of respect. The funeral which was largely attended, took place on Thursday, December 4th, at 9:15 A. M., to St. Ann's Church, where Requiem Mass was sung by Rev. Eugene L. Murray, P. P.
