Canada's Consumption of Butter, Eggs and Meat

Q. What is Canada's consumption of butter, eggs and meat?

A. The consumption of meats in Canada in 1926 is estimated at 1,533,700,000 pounds. The per capita consumption of all meats was estimated at 162.27 pounds for 1926 against 161.2 pounds for 1925 and for other important products for 1926 the per capita consumption was: butter 267,961,643 pounds or 28.54 pounds per capita; cheese 36,804,476 pounds or 3.92 pounds per capita; eggs 264,783,655 dozen or 28.2 dozen per capita; and poultry 90,212,585 pounds or 9.6 pounds per capita. The per capita consumption of butter and eggs is estimated to be higher in Canada than any other country in the world.

The New Idea Of Cancer

Many Cases Can be Cured if Reported Promptly.

IS CANCER HEREDITARY?

Many years ago it was believed that cancer was not only hereditary but that a measure of blame attached to the presence of this disease. People believed that a taint ran in families and that this showed itself in various forms, including cancer.

Scientific men, on examining into the facts, arrived at the opinion that cancer itself was not hereditary, although a certain susceptibility toward it did exist among members of some families. Whether this was due to the operations of chance or was transmitted from parent to offspring was not made clear.

Recently Miss Maud Slye of Chicago has announced the results of the breeding of thousands of mice which she has been experimenting with in order to determine whether cancer was or was not a hereditary characteristic. Mice were used in these experiments for the reason that human beings could not be recorded, nor could reliable records of cancer relating to men and women be obtained over a sufficient number of years. Miss Slye's opinion is that cancer is due to two principal factors: A susceptibility which is transmitted from one generation to another and to some exciting agent such as chronic irritation at the particular point where the cancer later develops. Medical men are not all convinced that Miss Slye's claims are all justified, but her results are receiving very careful consideration.

The idea that cancer is the result of an immoral act or an immoral life has been discarded. And no blame whatever can properly attach to cancer.

er is from time to time listened to by millions already and may yet be listened to by tens of millions at the same moment.

Milton has told us how "resistless eloquence wielded at will" the fierce democracy of Greece and the results that followed. The democracy of our day is a hundred times more numerous and apparently as easily swayed by revolutionary eloquence. We speak of the power of the press, sometimes boastfully, but we should remember that the power of the spoken word is greater still when the orator of the day may be heard at the same moment by the myriads of people in a score of nations.

In this flying age it is predicted that the battle of Armageddon may be fought in the air. May it not be equally true that the great and final struggle between the forces of right and wrong, between order and anarchy, civilization and barbarism, may be carried on by human voices utilizing the artillery of radio? Be that as it may, it is evident that a new agency of tremendous power will be exercised for both good and evil, has come into the world in the vast expansion of the area over which the human voice is being heard.

lature. The question arises, what mandate have the 24 so-called Liberal members to legislate for 100 per cent of the people in regard to what they shall eat or drink. The mandate is that of a very slender majority. Another question, raised by Mr. Bentley, President of the Temperance Alliance, is, What has the Saunders Government done toward carrying into effect the promises and pledges they made to the people during the election campaign? Mr. Bentley, in command with many other of their supporters apparently thinks they have done little or nothing to that end.

Premier Saunders "pronounced in favor of old age, pensions cannot be carried out without imposing new taxes, or increasing the existing burdens on the tax payers. But the King Government is determined that the pension system shall go into effect on the fifty-fifty basis and four Provinces in the West seem ready to adopt it. If the Liberal policy of keeping Federal and Provincial Governments "in line" for party purposes is to be maintained, the people of this Province will be compelled to come under the pension plan whether they desire to do so or not. The Provincial Government and Legislature must decide whether to accept or reject the pension plan. To accept is to take on a new and heavy burden. To reject is to help pay the old age pensions in all the other Provinces except our own and receive none of them.

Waterproofing Shoes

Dirty Pots

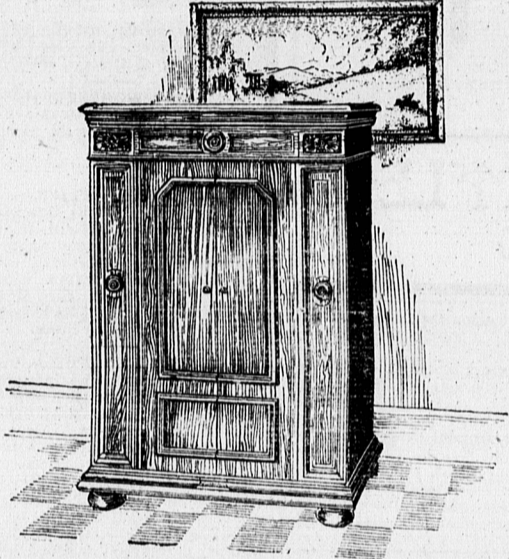
Instead of scouring and scraping the dirty pots, boil water in them, to which add a little washing soda. This is a much easier method and just as satisfactory.
