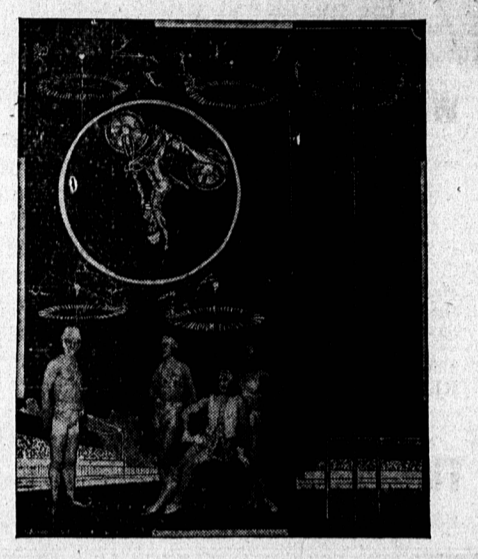

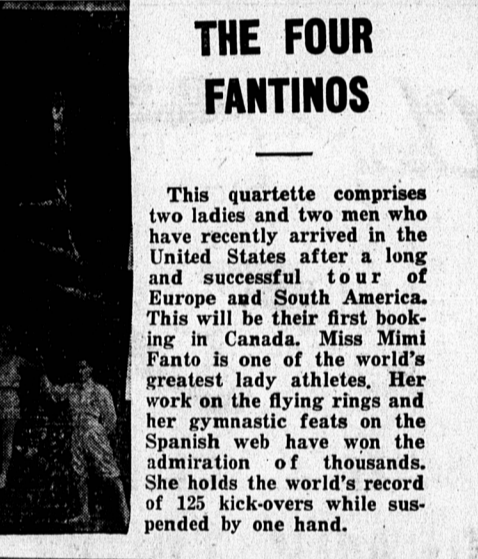

This quartette comprises two ladies and two men who have recently arrived in the United States after a long and successful tour of Europe and South America. This will be their first booking in Canada.



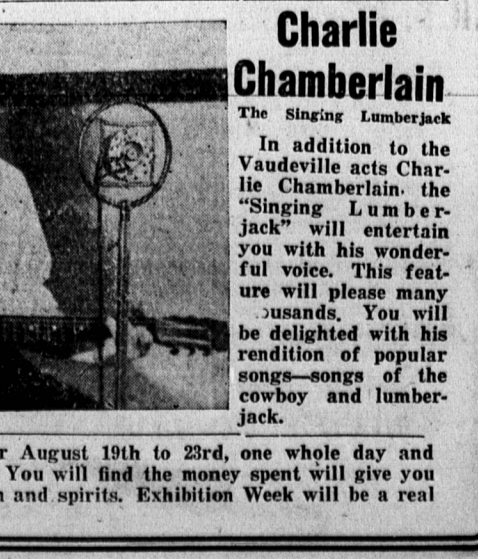

BRISK BUSINESS IN NEW BRUNSWICK HIDES

New Brunswick hides are in considerable demand of late, states the Industrial Department of the Canadian National Railway. Just recently a large consignment of horse and bull hides left the province for Japan; another is scheduled for the English market early in August. One exporting firm doing a large business with Japan and Russia has purchased hides in New Brunswick to the value of over \$140,000 since the latter part of April last.

PRODUCE

(Canadian Press) MONTREAL, Aug. 11.—Strength in cheese prices was the feature of the Montreal dairy and produce markets last week.

Cheese was selling at 10 1/2 to 10 3/4 cents per pound for no. 1 current Ontario yesterday after advancing considerably throughout the week. No. 1 Quebec were 9 1/2 to 9 3/4 cents for prints.

Butter prices were weaker with No. 1 in cartons or less going for 20 1/2 to 20 3/4 cents while 10 1/2 to 10 3/4 cents for solids and 22 to 22 1/2 cents for prints.

Lower prices were also chalked up for eggs. Graded shipments in cartons or less were mainly 27 cents a dozen for A-large, 25 cents for A-medium, 21 to 21 1/2 cents for B, and 19 to 19 1/2 cents for C.

New potatoes were down a little to 40 cents per 80-pound bag.
