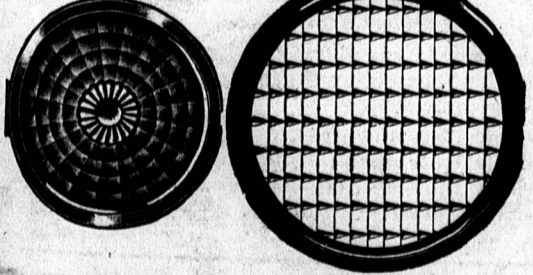

A special perfecting machine for cancelling the luxury stamps has arrived in the city and there will be furnished free to all dealers.

Collection of the sales and luxury taxes by means of stamps instead of by the present method will be inaugurated on November first.

Last month six million dollars of revenue was derived from the luxury tax, but this is not regarded as the probable maximum.

In some cases investigation has shown the law not being complied with through ignorance of its provisions.

In other cases there has been deliberate evasion and prosecutions in several score of cases are being initiated.

The full penalty will be asked to the end that the effect be salutary. Inland revenue officers by visiting stores and making purchases have detected many cases of the act being evaded.

A staff of thirty expert auditors distributed over the different inland revenue divisions have just been appointed to check up and see that the treasury is getting the revenue it is entitled to.

(Continued From Page 4.) A fair attendance for the opening day witnessed the program of racing yesterday.

The 2.16 Trot brought out five starters, among them the remarkable trotter Bill Sherman owned by the millionaire lumberman Mr. Alchorn and driven by the veteran driver Peter Carroll.

Mr. Kelly surprised his friends by winning second with Colorado L., the opinion being that he was too short of work to meet such strong competition.

Brage, driven by Frank Boutillier, had hard racing luck, making two bad breaks at very critical moments.

Gay Moko, owned by Frank Redding Sydney, and Victoria, owned by Dr. McAlister, made a good contest for the fourth position.

2.25 PACE.

This race, owing to the large number of starters, was raced in two divisions, the management very generously giving two full purses of \$500 each.

The first division was won by Dick C., owned by the MacKinnon Drug Company. In the first heat Dick trailed to the three-quarter pole and was then pulled out and won.

In each of the other heats he had a comfortable margin of safety being taken back at the wire.

Ed Locanda and Christie Dillon were distanced the first heat, Ed breaking harness and Christie going to a very bad break.

The second heat Queen Petress owned by Mr. Hoyt also caught the banner, not liking the soft padding.

Time—2:19; 2:16 1/2; 2:19. Second division had a much faster average of time, although the fastest heat in each were identical.

The race was won by Northern Mack, owned by Mr. Hoyt of Presque Isle, Maine. This is a remarkable pacer and is thought to be the making of a future champion.

Zua Bowman, owned by G. B. Fenwick of Sussex, N. B., won second money, coming from behind the second heat with a remarkable burst of speed landing the position.

In the final heat she trailed Northern Mack near the wire and finished on his pad, this being the fastest heat of the race.

Keemah Aubrey owned by Mr. Stuart of Kensington, won third money, making a splendid showing.

Winifred W., owned by Mr. Wedlock also put up a great race, considering she was in such hot company.
