**THE SITUATION.**

An entire change of front has been witnessed in the market the past week and a good object lesson has been given the bears as we advised you to expect in last week's letter. Loans have been heavily reduced and stocks have sustained sensational declines in consequence. Hearings on the Northern Pacific merger deal are now under way and it is intimated to us that a final decision will be handed down in favor of the railroads. This will be far reaching in its effect upon values and the market will discount it. The manipulators have already commenced aggressive action in the active issues, laying plans to discount this favorable action. Stocks should be bought on all recessions from now on.
