IS SUCCESSFUL AT RAT CATCHING

A TWENTY-KNOT FISHERY LAUNCH

WINDSOR, Ont., June 11.—The Government's new gasoline launch "Pill Box" which will be employed in the work of discouraging poaching by Americans in Canadian waters, has arrived here and will do duty on the St. Charles river and Lake Erie. The launch, which is of 23 h. p., and has a speed of 20 miles an hour, crossed from Toronto to Port Dalhousie in two hours and twenty minutes, with a heavy sea running at the time. Advice was received at the Fisheries Department Friday that United States poachers were working within two miles of the Canadian shore on Lake Erie, and the patrol boats will bestir themselves to place a check on the boat operations under way.

TOOK TO WOODS ON SEEING ENGINE

KENORA, Ont., June 12.—Twenty-three Indians, men, women, and children, are camped on the outskirts of the town, wondering at every fresh thing they see. The party is made up of several witnesses brought here by Sergeant Pat Egan of the Northwest Mounted Police, from Cat Lake reservation, as witnesses in the trial of an Indian charged with murder.

A. By Law for levying and specifying the rate of Assessment on Real Estate and Personal Property and Poll in the City of Charlottetown for a Water and Sewerage fund under Statute 1, Edward VII Chapter 2.

Be it Enacted by the City Council of the City of Charlottetown as follows:—

The rate of assessment on Real Estate for a Water and Sewerage fund under said Statute for the year commencing the first day of January A. D. 1906 and ending the thirty first day of December A. D. 1906 is hereby specified and fixed at the rate of one per cent or one percent on every dollar of the value of Real Estate as assessed by the Assessors of the Said City of Charlottetown in the general assessment Book and Valuation Roll of all Real Estate and Personal Property, liable to taxation in Said City and all persons liable to pay Poll Tax therein made and duly returned by them on the 10th day of May A. D. 1906.

The rate of assessment on Personal Property for such Water and Sewerage fund for the year commencing the first day of January A. D. 1906 and ending the thirty first day of December A. D. 1906 is hereby specified and fixed at the rate of one quarter of one per cent on every dollar of the value of Personal Property as assessed by the assessors of the Said City in said general Assessment Book and Valuation Roll made and duly returned by them as aforesaid.

The amount of Poll tax to be paid by every person returned by the said assessors in the said General Assessment Book and Valuation Roll as liable thereto for such water fund under said Statute for the year commencing the first day of January A. D. 1906 and ending the thirty first day of December A. D. 1906 is hereby specified and fixed at the rate of twenty five cents on every poll of every person so assessed and returned as aforesaid.

A. By Law for levying and specifying the rate of assessment on Real Estate and Personal Property in the City of Charlottetown for general civic purposes under Statute 3 Edward VII Chapter 17.

Be it enacted by the City Council of the City of Charlottetown as follows:—

The rate of assessment on Real Estate for general civic purposes under said Statute for the year commencing the first day of January A. D. 1906 and ending the thirty first day of December A. D. 1906 is hereby specified and fixed at the rate of one and one eighth per cent on every dollar of the value of Real Estate as assessed by the assessors of the said City of Charlottetown in the General Assessment Book and Valuation Roll of all Real Estate and Personal Property liable to taxation in said City and of all persons liable to pay Poll Tax therein made and duly returned by them on the 10th day of May A. D. 1906.

The rate of assessment on Personal Property for such general civic purposes for the year commencing the first day of January A. D. 1906 and ending the thirty first day of December A. D. 1906 is hereby specified and fixed at the rate of one and one eighth per cent of the value of Personal Property as assessed by the assessors of the said City in the said General Assessment Book and Valuation Roll made and duly returned by them as aforesaid.

A. By Law for allowing the rate of Discount in the assessments on Real Estate and Personal Property in the City of Charlottetown for general civic purposes for the current year ending the thirty first day of December A. D. 1906.

Be it enacted by the City Council of the City of Charlottetown as follows:—

Let a discount at the rate of two and one half per cent shall be allowed to all Tax payers who shall, on or before the twentieth day of July A. D. 1906 pay the City Clerk at his office the taxes severally due by them for the current year on Real Estate and Personal Property for civic purposes.
