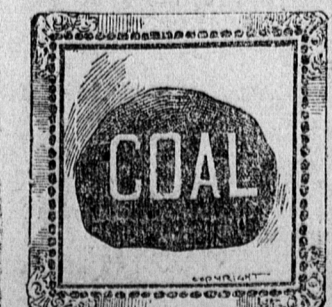

P. E. ISLAND'S LATEST

(From yesterday's Evening Guardian) The Halifax correspondent of the Montreal Financial Times writes as follows:—

Foxes and Oysters Limited. That is the very latest in the "Portua while you wait" branch of endeavor. And it's a Prince Edward Island proposition as one might suppose. For high financing the islanders can give the world acres and spades. If for tines can be made in foxes overnight, surely they can be made in foxes and oysters while you wait. The island province was famous for its oysters long before fox culture was thought of and the proposition was always a good one and is today with the bivalve commanding \$10.00 per barrel. The proposition is to breed foxes and breed oysters, and thus the man who puts his money into the venture will have the consolation of knowing that his eggs are not all in one basket.

The new company is called the Malpeque Bay Silver Foxes and Oysters Limited. It is just as well to understand that this does not mean that the oysters are silver as well as the foxes. The authorized capital is \$85,000.00, and the capital issued \$65,000.00. This is divided into 650 shares of \$100.00 each, with the usual "limited number of shares" offered at par. The directorate is composed of Prince Edward Islanders, New Brunswickers and Nova Scotians, and the property, the fox ranches and the oyster ranches are located at Matpeque Bay.

UNDERWEAR FACTORY.

Another sign, and a good one, that the islanders have decided not to stake their existence on the fox entirely, is the proposition of a number of Charlottetown citizens to establish a woolen industry. They propose to manufacture woolen underwear, sweaters, etc., and will erect a factory in Charlottetown, starting with employing thirty hands, and, as the promoter puts it, gradually increase and expand until the Standard Linen, the factory of 500. All this is contingent on the encouragement shown by the town council of Charlottetown, endorsed by ask for a free site with suitable buildings thereon or a bonus of \$600 per year for twenty years, with exemption from civic taxation for a period of twenty years. This institution, the promoter told the council, would keep "the boys" at home for one thing, and would provide a home market for the island's surplus wool, about 150,000 pounds being produced in that province every year. The proposition is being favorably received and Standard may rise keen with a competitor in the near future. Labor is cheap on the island and the local market is not insignificant.

FREE TRADE DEFENDED.

LONDON, Dec. 8.—In a speech at Oldham on Saturday, Premier Asquith defended free trade on the ground that the taxation of foreign manufacturers was necessarily followed by the taxation of food, but if Britain and others continued expenditures at the present rate during the next decade it would cause great disquietude. He foreshadowed heavy demands for national education and hinted at the widening of the scope of income tax. As to reducing armaments, he said, the best hope was in concerted pressure by all people of the civilized world on those responsible.

STRANDED SHIP NOT IN DANGER.

SAN-DOMINGO, Dec. 8.—The Clyde line steamship Seminole, which has been beached at Puerto Plata, on the north coast, is not believed to be in a serious condition, according to the latest advices received here.

The Seminole, which sailed from New York last Saturday for ports in the West Indies, struck some obstruction while entering the harbor at Puerto Plata and began to make water rapidly. She was run ashore to prevent her sinking. Part of her cargo was landed. It was in a slightly damaged condition. Efforts are now being made to repair the steamship so that she can proceed on her voyage.

Considerable water has been pumped out of the vessel and the cargo in the lower hold has been greatly damaged.

A German steamer, on entering Puerto Plata harbor this morning, hit the same obstruction, the nature of which has not been ascertained. This steamer escaped injury.

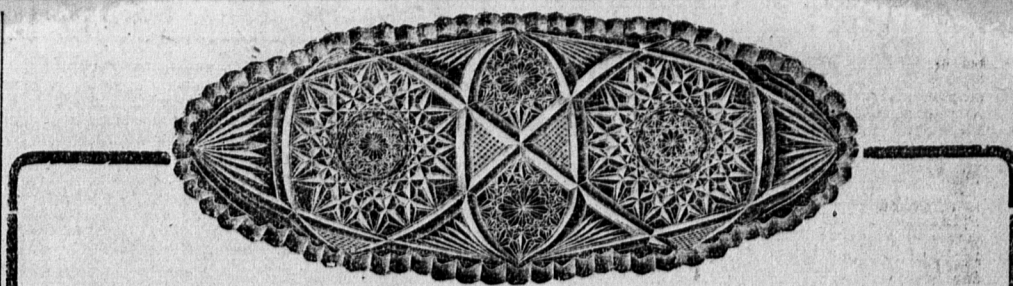

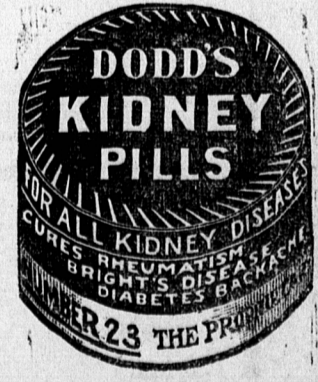
