ONLY CANADIAN SOLDIER IN THE SERBIAN ARMY

Roy Leitch, of Charlottetown, Has Returned to His Former Home—Is on Sick Leave, and Will Go Back in November.

Mr. Roy Leitch who has been an officer in the Serbian army has arrived in the city on a four months sick leave. He arrived in Rimouski on Saturday having landed from the S. S. Miskenable and will return to the front early in November.

Speaking to The Moncton Times Mr. Leitch said he had been in the heart of Serbia for about a year. He went to the front early in September last and was sent by the war office direct to Serbia. He was with the Second Serbian army under Marshal Stepanovitch one of the greatest of the Serbian Generals, and was in the whole of the great battle which began at Lazarevac, serving on the division of the artillery. Mr. Leitch served with the second army up to the time he left for home. Mr. Leitch was injured by his horse in the big battle of Suvabor, where he says the Serbians gained one of the most marvelous victories in military history.

Asked about the conditions in Serbia Mr. Leitch said they were very good now. The army was well fed and well supplied. Civilians, however, were not faring so well for food, and in some sections there was actual want. The rich, he said were really worse off than the poorer classes, because they received no government allowance.

The crops, Mr. Leitch said, had to be looked after by old men, women and children, as all the men eligible for military duty were in the armies. The Charlottetown man came out of Serbia through Greece. About thirty wounded Canadians came over with Mr. Leitch on the Miskenable. Among the number was the Ontario Highlander, who passed through Moncton on the Ocean Limited Sunday afternoon to Halifax. The Halifax man was wounded at Ypres and was permanently disabled. He was a young man about 26 years of age but Mr. Leitch did not remember his name.

Mr. Leitch says the Serbian operations were greatly hampered in the early stages of the war by the hostility of Bulgarian irregulars who cut off their supplies of ammunition. To this and the outbreak of typhoid he says, was due the earlier Serbian reverses but the army is now in fine shape and he has no doubt will give a good account of itself. Mr. Leitch says that when the Austrians were forced back it was not a retreat but a mad flight, an utter rout. They cut loose their horses, left their guns and even their clothing and for 100 miles the country was strewn with the impediments of war. He could not say anything of the present disposition of the Serbian army outside the operations, with artillery duels and aeroplane raids, were decidedly interesting and spectacular.

Mr. Leitch is a great admirer of the Serbian people. He had been studying their history for sometime and that was one of the reasons that induced him to take the post of teacher in the Prince of Wales College in Charlottetown, and offer his services to that country. The Serbians are possessed of a sturdy independence which will permit of no injustice. In this respect they are superior even to the British and Canadians. Though in some ways they are inferior. Every Serbian is a gentleman in the rough; treat him kindly and he cannot do too much for you. As the only Canadian in the Serbian army, Mr. Leitch said every deference was shown him, he was in fact, used as a prince.

Sanitary arrangements are bad in Serbia, the young soldier said, and a great need was Red Cross workers and stretcher bearers who would be exposed to danger at the front. He hoped to be able to get volunteers for this purpose in the Maritime Provinces but their own expenses until they reached Serbia.

EXPLOSIVES FACTORY BY LIGHTNING STRUCK

PERRY SOUND, Ont., Aug. 30.—A violent thunderstorm passed over this section during which lightning struck one of the drying houses of the Canadian Explosives Limited at Nobel, and set it on fire, the fire communicating to another drying house, both of which were destroyed, together with a quantity of cordite. Seven persons were injured by the flames, but only one seriously. This will not interfere with the operations, as there are still eight drying houses, and the burned ones can be quickly replaced.
The same storm struck the buildings of William Hamill, a farmer living about a mile from here, and three cows were killed. Mr. Hamill was also injured by the lightning.

The various walks of life from which the men are drawn cover a wide range, the following professions and trades being represented in the make-up of the rank and file of the corps: Six bankers, ten school teachers, sixteen salesmen, two merchants, seventy farmers. There are civil engineers, accountants, students, druggists, telegraphists, millers, machinists, locomotive engineers, chauffeurs, blacksmiths, carpenters, fishermen, barbers, jewelers, painters, butchers, sailors, lobster packers, soap makers, shoemakers, etc., also represented.

As regards the religious leanings of the men nearly all the leading denominations are represented. There are 35 Roman Catholics, 65 Presbyterians, 16 Baptists, 21 Methodists, 18 Church of England, 2 Central Christian, 2 Congregational, making a total of 157. This table was made up some days ago.

Naturally in recruiting a large number of men like this, a few undesirable are bound to find their way into the ranks, but these men very quickly responding heartily to every call made upon them. This is as it should be. Each day at church parade a noticeable improvement may be seen in the smarter, more soldierly appearance of the men. Every man in the battery is eager to get to the front as speedily as possible and hence diligent use is made of the opportunities
