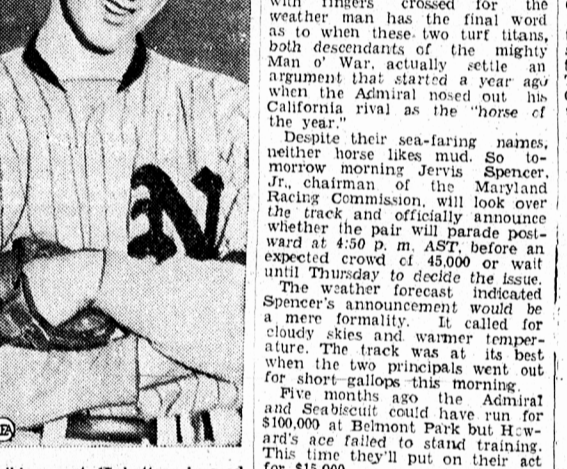
Amateur Hockey Far Behind Professional Dutch Hiller Claims

Although the Cincinnati Reds' classy catcher met stiff opposition from such other valued workmen as Bill Lee, Arky Vaughan and Mel Ott, the 24 members of the Writers' voting committee gave him a sizeable margin with 229 points under a new scoring system. This total compared with a possible perfect score of 336, had every member picked him for first place.
