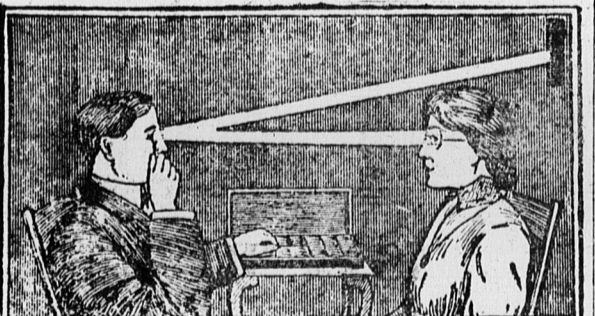

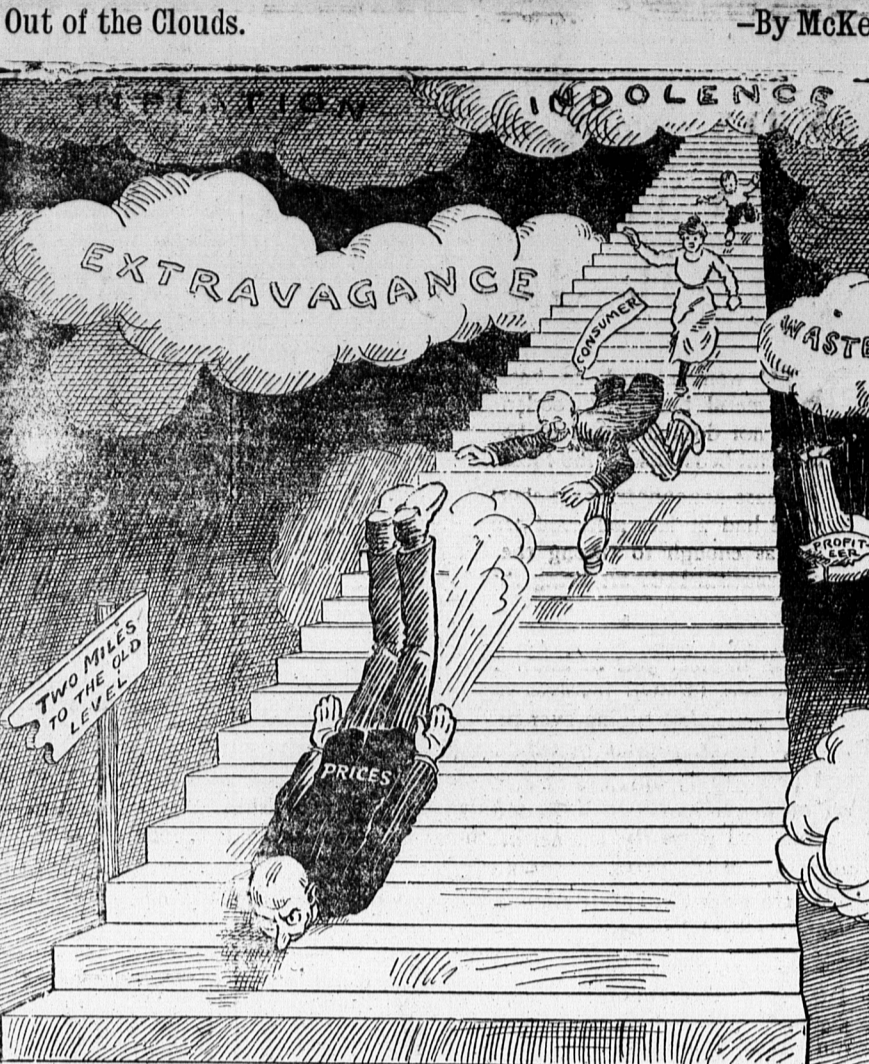

**King Albert Asked To Mediate**

PARIS, June 14.—King Albert of Belgium has been asked by the Supreme Council to use his good offices toward the settlement of the dispute between Poland and Czechoslovakia regarding occupation of Tscheng District, according to a report published here today.

**Irish Elections Won by Sinn Fein**

(Special to The Guardian.)  
DUBLIN, June 14.—Detailed returns from the County Council and rural district election today indicated an overwhelming majority for Sinn Fein who captured 459 seats. A combination of Sinn Fein Republican and Labor with the Ulster Nationalist parties captured 395. Unionists obtained the remaining hundred and four seats.

**Restoring Order In Albania**

(Special to The Guardian.)  
ROME, June 14.—Arrival of strong reinforcements at Valona has resulted in the restoration of order at that Albanian city, according to semi-official statement today. No official confirmation was received of the report that the Italian garrisons at Tepelini and Drashol, totaling 800 men and 30 officers, had been taken prisoners by Albanian forces under Mustapha Kemal Pasha. An official statement issued yesterday declared 600 Albanians had been killed and hundreds wounded in an attack upon the Italian garrison at Ylioni. Ten Italians were killed and fifty wounded, the statement said.

**Chapter of Railway Fatalities**

CHICAGO, June 14.—One man was killed near here early today when a Fore Marquette passenger train ran head on into a standing freight train. Bateman was conductor of the passenger train bringing a load of week-enders back from Michigan resorts. Seven passengers were injured in the wreck. The wreckage caught fire.

**St. John Man Killed By Auto**

ST. JOHN, N. B. June 14.—J. W. McDuffie, aged 82, a Jeweller, died Saturday afternoon from injuries when struck by a motor car driven by Hazen Hamilton.

**CLERGYMEN NOT TO GIVE UP TOBACCO.**

ATLANTIC CITY, N. J., June 10.—The use of tobacco will not be sacrificed for the church by the clergymen of the General Synod of the Reformed Churches of America, the ministers decided at the closing session of the Synod here yesterday. A resolution proposing that the clergymen give up the weed in order to make their church contributions more liberal was defeated.

**RETIRED CHIEF JUSTICE OF NEW BRUNSWICK PASSES AWAY.**

ST. JOHN, N. B., June 12.—Sir Ezekiel McLeod, retired Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of New Brunswick, died of pneumonia at his home in Hampton. He had been ill seriously only a few days although for a week or two previous to an attack of pneumonia he had not been in the best of health. Sir Ezekiel became quite well known in the Dominion when he represented St. John in the House of Commons and his name came into greater national prominence when he played an important part in the investigation of the sinking of the Canadian Pacific Liner Empress of Ireland, which collided with the Norwegian coal carrying steamer "Storstad" in the St. Lawrence river in 1913. He was born at Penobscot, King's County, October 20, 1840.

**P. E. I. Presbyterial**

The thirty third annual meeting of the P. E. I. Presbyterial will be held at Hunter River on Wednesday July 7th (seventh). The morning session opens at ten o'clock. The Executive meets on Tuesday evening at half past seven. Names of delegates are to be sent to Mrs. D. M. McLeod, Hunter River before June 24th. Parties going by auto on Wednesday morning should notify Mrs. McLeod to that effect. Delegates going by train will please purchase regular return tickets and are expected to arrive on Tuesday afternoon July 6th, those from the West on the train leaving Summerside at 1:55 and those from the East on train leaving Charlottetown at 4:40, all arriving at Hunter River about six o'clock. Auxiliary treasurers are asked to have all funds forwarded to Presbyterial treasurer Mrs. A. E. Morrison, Charlottetown by June 25th. The general president Mrs. Forbes and Rev. Luther Young of Corea will be present and address the meetings. The Presbyterial secretary would like all returns to be sent in promptly.

**President Gompers Addresses Convention**

MONTREAL, June 14.—President Gompers drew applause from the American Federation of Labor Convention today when he ridiculed the One Big Union movement, in an extemporaneous address. "To me," he said, "the one big union idea seems comparable to the attempt to unscramble an omelette spilt in baking. Social progress would be halted were the labour movement to disintegrate. The American labour movement is pressing always onward and upward. Referring to the Peace Treaty, Gompers said, "It is pitiable that the United States has not ratified this common need of nations." Workers in the most backward countries would be helped by ratification of the Treaty," Gompers agreed. By unanimous vote the convention ordered full support to be given coast-wise longshoremen on strike in New York and other Atlantic coast ports. The convention today honored the soldiers killed in war. At the suggestion of President Gompers, all the delegates rose and stood silent for one minute.

**THE USE OF ARMOURIES FOR POULTRY SHOWS**

The Canadian National Poultry Association recently made representation to the Federal Department of Agriculture with a view to obtain permission from the Department of Militia and Defence to allow the use of armouries for the holding of poultry shows and exhibitions. In this connection the Department of Militia and Defence state that subject to the interests of Militia Units, not being adversely affected, instructions were issued some time ago to General Officers Commanding Districts that they were authorized to permit the use of armouries for any specific purpose by non-military organizations, subject to either fire insurance being taken out on the building by those proposing to use it, or special arrangements satisfactory to him (the General Officer Commanding the District) being made to safeguard the building.




