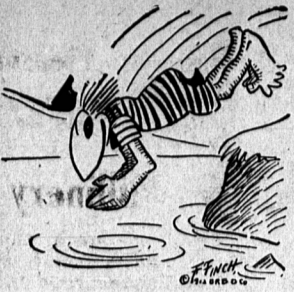

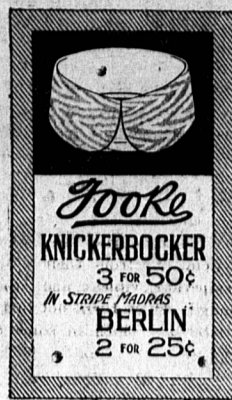
grance Alliance to succeed Rev. Thomas Marshall who has left the Province.

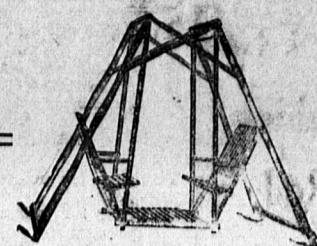
