My dear friends: Before this reaches you, you will have been informed through another source of the unfortunate accident which befell your son in Glasgow.

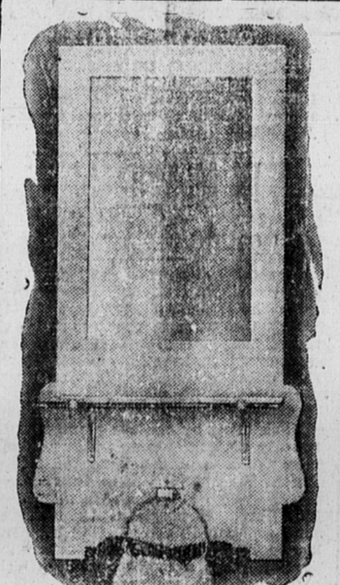
