Lawrence Of Arabia In India At Time of Alleged 1927 Plot

First Detailed Itinerary of Mysterious Hero's Adventures Given In House Of Commons.

LONDON, Dec. 12.—Great Britain's glamorous "Lawrence of Arabia," who was in India in 1927 at the time when the Soviet government charges he was in the thick of a "capitalist" plot to overthrow the Moscow rulers, Frederick Montague, Under-Secretary of State for Air, told the House of Commons yesterday.

It was the first detailed itinerary of Lawrence's adventures that the world has had in a long time. Aircraftman Shaw as Colonel Lawrence is now known sailed for India in December of 1926, Mr. Montague said, and arrived there in the
