Presbytery Says Rockwood Has "Itch For Fame" HALIFAX, March 20—(CP)—The Halifax-Lunenburg Presbytery of the Presbyterian Church said in a statement today that those who knew Rev. Perry F. Rockwood, who resigned his St. James Church at Truro, N.S., after being found guilty of making an attempt to split the Presbyterian Church, "declare that he suffers from delusions of greatness and an itch for fame."

The statement added that Mr. Rockwood "has taken as his master Dr. Joseph Goebbels and works on the principle that if a lie is big enough and told often enough, some people will believe it."

At Truro, Mr. Rockwood, who preached last Sunday to a large congregation in a hall, said he had no comment to make on the statement at the present time, other than that he still adhered to what he had said in the four sermons which got him into trouble with his church.
