I may note further that nine-tenths of my sermon consisted of Scriptural quotations, and as no reference to or any question is raised thereon, I may take it that my quotations and interpretations were passed as correct.

I pass by the harmless little skit about epiphany and newspaper clippings, if the contents thereof be true as to fact and history they are in every way acceptable as proofs and have been so received in evidence thousands of times.

In conclusion, let me say I have been most scrupulous and careful in all my relations, private, social and public, not even mentioning the word baptism in my visitations, realizing the conscientious difference of opinion and practice upon this question, and if other persons had been as scrupulous and honorable, possibly the sermon in question might not have been delivered.

Nevertheless, being fully persuaded in my own mind as to the Scriptural orthodoxy of all the principles I profess, preach and practice, I claim the right, and shall exercise it when I think judicious, to lay down in my own church for the instruction of my own people all these tenets and doctrines, admitting and allowing all other churches the like freedom within their own borders. I will not if I know it either in any private house or the pulpit of any church I may occupy advance or recommend or advocate anything opposed to the principles and doctrines upon which such church or churches are founded.




