GRAND TRUNK WILL TAKE OVER LINE.

OTTAWA, Sept. 12—Arrangements are progressing for the leasing by the Grand Trunk Pacific railway of the Winnipeg-Superior Junction section of the Transcontinental railway. Chairman Smithers and Vice-President Wainwright, of the G.T.R., had an interview with the prime minister this afternoon and arranged for a conference with Hon. Mr. Borden, Hon. Mr. Cochrane and Major Leonard, of the Transcontinental commission tomorrow morning. The section is pronounced by the commission to be completed and the G.T.P. was given a month on which to exercise its option of lease. It did not do so in that exact period but negotiations were delayed owing to the absence of
