from the crown. All rootlets of inches always sure to follow. However, the course left on. If done with care, the contrivance is very effective, in stealing rootlets as pulled may be placed side by side in line on the ground and the tops cut off with a straight-mouthed spade or shovel. They should be handled to avoid bruising and stored in a cellar or pit for the winter.
