she would have understood. For no one ever did as much to guard and sanctify the family as did Jesus, yet here he is with a message perfecting the family relationship, saying that the best family of all is the one with spiritual rather than human ties. This makes the Christian relationship peculiarly intimate and tender and enduring. The fact that there was a "crowd" gathered about him and that he said "These" were his brothers and sister and mother should remind us that the true Brotherhood know neither ratio nor social barrier, but like the arms of the Cross reaches out to embrace all classes and conditions.

As a closing thought the speaker pointed out the conditions of initiation which may be learned from the different Gospel accounts of the incident. To enter this fraternity one must be a "Disciple" that is a pupil. It is impossible to be a true Christian Brother without Bible study. He must also be a child of the Heavenly Father, and lastly in daily living he must "do the will of His Father in Heaven."

"We trust in the Cross for our Salvation," said the preacher, "but no one is effectively clinging to the Cross of Christ who is not at the same time bearing his own Cross." The Rebekahs also attended in a body. The Oddfellows choir sang splendidly.

On Sunday evening last the members of the I. O. O. F. Summerside marched to the Baptist Church where Rev. A. K. Herman preached an excellent sermon.

From the text "Who are my Brethren?" Matthew 12:48, Mr. Herman developed the subject "The Ideal Brotherhood." While "Brother" is one of the sweetest and most sacred words in our vocabulary how often as in the case of Cain the first brother, the treacherous brothers of Joseph and the tricky Jacob, and many a modern instance, has been dragged into the mire of sin and selfishness. The word therefore needs to be thought of at its best and that best is found in the use which Jesus Christ made of it. The story in which we find our text shows in the first place that he preached brotherhood. Picture him while conducting this great class gathered around him and having a man tap him on the shoulder and say "Your mother and brothers stand without desiring to speak with you." He might have whispered, "Tell them I will be there in a minute." But here was a text for a sermon on one of his great themes and for the benefit of the ages he used it. "Behold my mother and my Brethren, for whom ever shall do the will of my Father who is in Heaven, the same is my brother, and sister and mother." And so in word and deed he ever proclaimed the doctrine which tonight is so much upon our hearts the doctrine of Brotherhood which is another name for the Church.

But what are the ideal characteristics of the ideal Brotherhood? Studying the context we learn that it is not a flesh and blood relationship. One might imagine Mary shuddering as her son thus announced that any matronly woman who obeyed God was his mother. Grainer, St. John. But had she remembered that he came not to destroy but to fulfill

you to make a special effort to have as much as possible of your statute labor worked before cropping begins. This should apply specially to your dragging and road machining, both of which lose a lot of their value if left till the roads are dried up later in the season.

"With regard to dragging, there is no operation considering its cost which is of near equal value, and with this idea in mind, the Department has contracted for a supply of Drags which will be furnished free of charge to all Road Masters who need them. Please see that as much as possible is made of the road drag before the road finally crumbles up - especially on the improved Highway and whenever possible your labor for dragging after rains later in the season. While it is proposed to have a system of Patrol work in improved Highways during this season, it would be impossible to cover all of these roads by patrol at the time in Spring when it is of greatest value.

"Regarding your machine work, I am writing to all machine operators asking them to see that the machines under their care are in shape for work now, so that operations may start as early as possible. If the present fine weather continues, many sections of our roads will be in shape for work before the middle of April and a very special effort should be made to have all road machines at work whenever conditions will permit. Please co-operate with your machine operator, and have your arrangements completed so that no delay may occur to prevent the start of the season. It would be suggested that it is better to make a good heavy job of your road machining, and finish it well as far as you go, rather than undertake too much mileage and leave it poorly finished. This should appear particularly true to any work done later in the season.

"I wish to make a most earnest appeal to everyone connected with our organization for successful work during this year. Let our watchword be, first, EARLY WORK, second CONTINUOUS DRAGGING, and if we put forth every effort along these lines success will be assured. Let us make "a long pull, a strong pull, and a pull all together," to the end that this Province may enjoy for the coming season the best roads in all its history. ADVICE TO ROADMASTERS

The following is a copy of a letter which was sent by the Minister of Public Works to the Road Masters at the beginning of the season, and which has borne good fruit.

As we prepare to commence our second year of road work under the present administration, I am taking the liberty of addressing you a few words of suggestion with regard to our effort along this line.

"Judging from present appearances work may start unusually early this Spring, and as you are aware the early work is of much greater value than that done later in the season. There may be a chance this year to get the bulk of it done before Spring work commences on the land, and consequently I would strongly urge
