ROME, Nov. 24.—Mentri and Ricotti Garibaldi, the sons of the famous Italian patriot, have written to the newspapers protesting against the demonstration summoned by the young Garibaldians in favor of the Boers. They declare that Italy must remain the friend of England, who helped her, and aided the Garibaldians in the wars that culminated in Italian independence.

In Park Street church Sunday evening a service of an unusually interesting character was held, attended by one of the largest and most unique audiences ever assembled in Halifax. It was a gathering of college students, addressed by college men, on the subject of college religion. The service was under the chairmanship of President Forrest, and Professor Andrews, of Mount Allison, was one of the speakers. The chief speaker was H. W. Hicks, of New York, travelling secretary of the International Y. M. C. A.'s of America, whose visit to Halifax was the occasion of the meeting. The church was filled, a large proportion of the congregation being Dalhousie students. Especially to those latter Mr. Hicks addressed some words of forceful, thoughtful, earnest student talks.—Hx.
