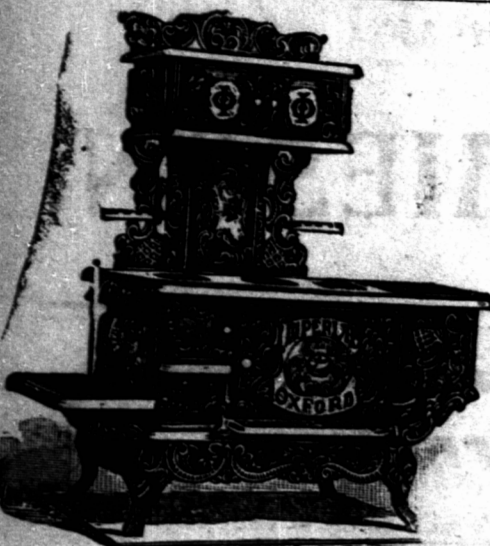

Although the date of the New Brunswick elections is not yet fixed the Opposition are organizing for the fray. Like the Ministerial party the Opposition will be a composite body made up of Liberals and Conservatives. In the present House the Government has a large majority, nearly forty of the forty-five members being its supporters. The leading Conservative newspapers of the Province, the St. John Sun and Moncton Times, are squarely opposed to the Ministry notwithstanding that Premier Tweedie and Attorney General Pugsley are old-time Conservatives. The St. John Telegraph supports the Government. The St. John Globe and the Moncton Transcript hold a more independent attitude, but favor straight party lines in provincial affairs.

Patrick Blake, formerly of this city and now of Sydney, complains to The Patriot of the delays and want of care in the transmission of perishable products between this Island and the Sydney market. Owing to delays and to consignees not being notified in time, or to their being unable to get delivery of their consignments arriving at night, he says many products arrive in bad order and have to be destroyed. Refrigerator cars sometimes reach Sydney without ice. Mr. Blake points out the necessity of cold storage on the Steam Navigation Company's boats, and says that poultry shipped from the Island to Sydney generally arrives in bad order, owing partly to their crops being filled when slaughtered. These are all points of vital interest in relation to our large trade with Sydney. They call for prompt remedy so far as they are remediable.

Admiral Lord Charles Bessford is now in New York and has been talking over naval and war matters. He thinks both the British army and navy have gained most valuable lessons from the Boer war. No country save Britain, for instance ever landed heavy guns from its ships for use in field operations. He thinks submarine boats are yet an uncertain quantity. Britain has now five of them and is building more. They ought not to be underrated or overrated. If the submarine boat turns out a success it means the key to the English Channel, so far as Britain is concerned. The trouble with them is that they cannot take care of themselves. They have to be carried on the warships from place to place, which of course takes up space, and warships in

action need all the room they can get. Has y's target practice in which the battleships Majestic and Terrible sunk the Belleisle taught a lot about the different types of battleships and their respective usefulness.

Prof. F. E. Prince the Dominion Fishery Commissioner writes to Hon. D. A. McKinnon that he expects to visit Charlottetown this week to ascertain and report upon the most desirable site for a lobster hatchery on the Island. It is believed that a lobster hatchery may prove as useful in replenishing our waters with these valuable shellfish as the salmon hatcheries have proved in other parts of the Dominion.

The Hague Peace Conference called together at the instance of Cesar Nicholas two years ago, resulted in the appointment of a permanent arbitration tribunal representing fifteen nations, embracing all the maritime powers, only a few nations that are of no international significance not being included. But for over a year and a half the great tribunal has had nothing to do. Now it has its first case, submitted by two American republics, the United States and Mexico. The matter is one which would not in any case have led to war. When Mexico became free from Spain she undertook by treaty certain obligations to expend the proceeds of a certain Catholic church fund for the benefit of the church in certain localities. The territory included California, which subsequently passed to the United States by conquest. The question for the tribunal is whether Mexico is still bound to pay over the proceeds of this "pious fund" to its originally intended uses. Mexico has hitherto refused payment and the arrears have accumulated.
