transportation companies. There is reason to believe that this charge has foundation. The great railroads which bring their continental service almost to your doors—the C. P. R. and I. C. R., are giving you the same service as they give other places. Both these roads are great corporations and well managed. It is regrettable that the C. P. R. train is almost daily behind time.

Add that delay to the slowness of local service and the passengers from New Brunswick rarely reach Charlottetown as early as 10 o'clock, sometimes much later. The Charlottetown Steam Navigation Company is responsible for some of this delay. Their boat, the Empress, makes a rather slow passage on the 35 mile route from Point du Chene to Summerside, two-and-a-half hours at best, and longer at worst on the average probably about 12 miles an hour. The schedule from Point du Chene to Charlottetown is practically five hours a distance of about 75 miles, an average of 15 miles an hour. The Lake Champlain Steamboats make 20 miles an hour. Most railroads these days make at least 30 miles, often 40, as the two railroads do, on their main lines. But the service for the Island—from the Junction to the boat—is slow and inferior in all respects to that of the main lines. This discrimination is perhaps natural because the Island service itself is so decidedly inferior. The trains are not up to the standard and they lag along as though there was nothing on the Island to do. There is only one fairly good train the express, but it is

not first-class and even its engine has to back to take the grades. It has been seen on other trains cars so old and nasty that they are hardly fitted for cattle cars. The trains are small, inferior and hauled by little "dinky" engines that cannot make speed. The road is all curves and the trains corkscrew through the Island like snakes. The cars wobble enough to set one dizzy. The Government owns the road and the people ought to rise in rebellion and have it straightened and widened. The time would then come to ferry the cars across the straits. It is no doubt possible to reduce the trip from Point du Chene to Charlottetown to three hours or slightly over.

The Northumberland between Picton and Charlottetown is equally slow. It is said that these two boats are run at slow speed to save coal. Aside from speed these boats are not subject to much criticism. They furnish plain but excellent meals at 30 cents. The steamboats that come from Boston direct and St. Lawrence River ports are all old, slow and anything but attractive. They are no credit to the transportation companies which serve the Island. A better service than this line now give I feel sure and an increased traffic and revenue. The Dominion Atlantic service out of Boston, by boat and train, is no doubt the best managed and most comfortable feeder of the Island service. The St. John boats from Boston also give an excellent service and the I. C. R. gives much greater speed than the Island road.

The people of the Island are not great travelers yet the business of over a hundred thousand people should have better transportation service than they have now. In this important matter the initiative must come from the sufferers—the people of the Island. If they do not undertake to remedy their troubles no one else will.

"Sweep before your own door," is an old saying that admonishes us all to take up our own problems and settle them right. You need good hotels—always a little better than the sum charged, you want automobiles, because they are needed for service that you cannot get in any other way; you need some attention to the transportation companies. After all, you must attract people and serve them well or nothing can help you. Don't overcharge, rather undercharge, for what you give and you will bring trade and prosperity.

Individuals and peoples are usually taken at their own measure. It need not surprise the go-ahead people of the Island that the people they do business with—including the Government—are now taking them at their own measure; and no doubt they are getting what they deserve.

When strangers, who have heard of the beauties of the Island, come to the Province they marvel at the hotel and transportation facilities. These things are the subject of criticism when speaking to those of us who stand up for the Island.
