Willys Knight Car Makes Fine Record In Official Test

In an official test made yesterday over the road between Charlottetown and Summerside the Willys Knight car of Mr. G. D. Wright covered the return trip, one hundred and four miles, on the remarkably small amount of three gallons, five and one half pints of gasoline. This gave a fraction over twenty-eight miles to the gallon and the test was in every way a thoroughly practical one. The car, itself weighing 2,800 pounds, carried four occupants and averaged about thirty miles an hour. Premium gasoline was used. Mr. McLaine of the McLaine Service Station, who is the agent of the Willys Knight car in this city, was the driver. Accompanying him were Mr. Wright, Coun. Rattray, and a representative of the Guardian. The gasoline tank, when filled at the Service Station before leaving, was sealed by independent witnesses and every precaution was taken to ensure accuracy of measurement throughout the trip.
