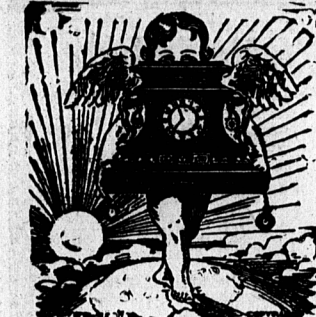

CIVIL WAR RELICS. Steamships Massachusetts and Bunker Hill will be placed in service for the season.

MINNEAPOLIS, June 17—Minneapolis and peanut are the two leading products of the farms that surround Petersburg, Va., where federal troops were under siege for ten months during the civil war. Dr. F. M. Gibson, whose offices are in Pillsbury building, has just returned from a visit to Petersburg and other battlefields in Virginia and Maryland, bringing with him federal relics.

Steamships Massachusetts and Bunker Hill will be placed in service for the season. The Massachusetts will make the initial trip from Boston on the date named; since last season the Massachusetts and Bunker Hill have had about \$400,000 expended upon them for equipment and re-arrangement of their passenger carrying facilities.
