NEWSY FARM NOTES

NATURE NOTES, JUNE, 1930

Almost from the first of the month the temperature here was very high, and ranged mostly from 80 to 90 degrees F., the latter being reached (in the shade) in the afternoon of the 16th.

Following the star maps month by month, it is interesting to see how the planets have been in line just over the sunset in the west. First, in April, Jupiter and Mercury were in the same quarter a few degrees apart.

On June 28th, just at the time of the most violent wind, I observed the moon and Venus about three times the diameter of the moon apart.

I note that a Guardian reporter recently captured a large moth, having a wing-spread of six inches and whose basic colors were brown and black tinted with red and gray.

The other morning, about 4.30, I was aroused by a scuffling on the wire window screen. It was a bat, who was looking for a good place of retreat after his nocturnal hunting for winged pests, such as mosquitoes.

The Hoary Bat is said to migrate as far south as Mexico, when its taken two species—the Long-eared Bat, Plecotus auritus, and another whose name I forget.

Bats are an ancient race; fossil bats have been found in the early geological strata both on this continent and in Europe, thus showing

their presence on the earth at a very remote period.

A newspaper paragraph states that a "white whale" was observed by a N. S. revenue cutter on June 10th about 400 miles south east of Cape Race, Newfoundland.

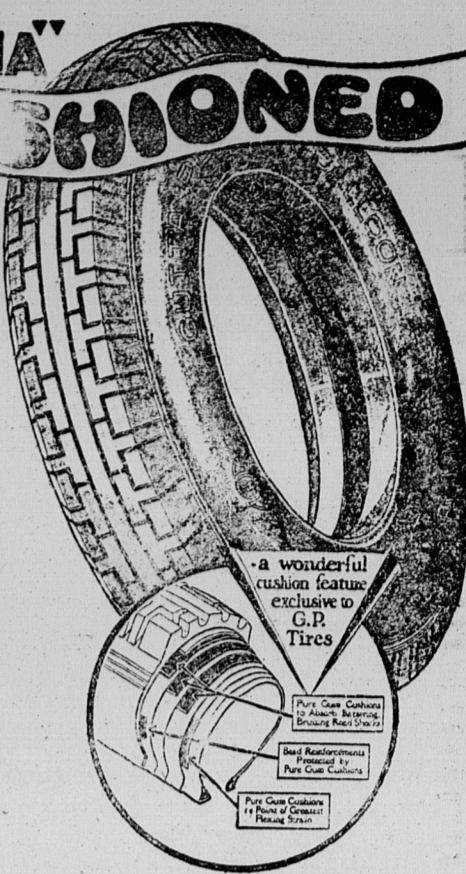

Lady Conan Doyle, the former Jean Leckie and two sons and a daughter were at the bedside when Sir Arthur died at Windlesham, his home here. He was 71 years old, having been born at Edinburgh on May 22, 1859.
