Excellent speeches were given by Stipendiary Magistrate, Mr. Neil McLeod, Principal Campbell, Rev's. J. M. Withycombe and W. H. Smith. Never in its history has such a demonstration been witnessed in Summerside.

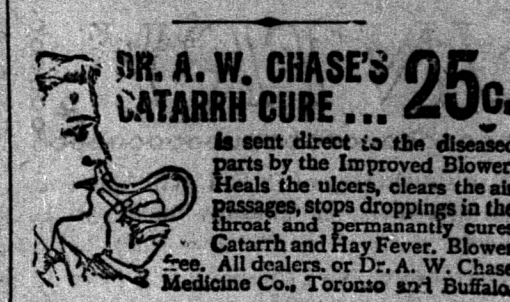
