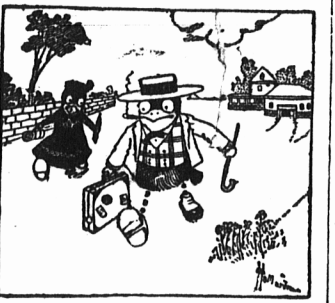
PRECERT AND PRACTICE.

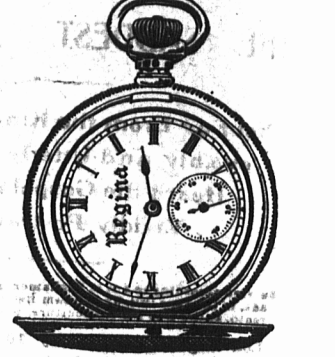
