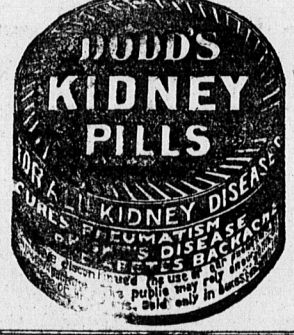

There were 75 passengers from East River ports by the S.S. City of London yesterday morning and the following cargo: 6 tons hay and straw, 30 boxes cheese, 25 bags potatoes and five crocks butter.
