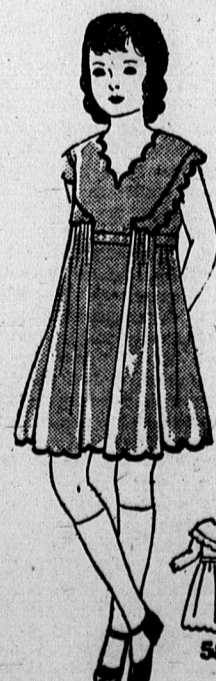

Cheese Bars: One small cake of cream cheese, 1 tablespoon chopped pimento, 1 tablespoon finely shredded sweet pepper, 1 dessertspoon finely chopped olives, a little salt and cayenne pepper. Mix all together and add enough whipped cream to blend. Press into a shallow, well-buttered pan, put on ice, and when cold cut in squares. Serve with a green salad.

Stuffed Celery: Scrape and wash and cut celery into two-inch pieces. Have ready two tablespoons pimento cream cheese, mixed with 1 tablespoon finely chopped walnuts and a little cream Season with paprika. Stuff celery sticks with this mixture, and lay on top of each stick a thin strip of pimento. Serve cold.

CREAM RICE PUDDING

4 tablespoons rice 1/2 cup sugar 1/4 teaspoon salt 2 1/4 cups St. Charles Milk 1 1/4 cups water Nutmeg

Wash the rice thoroughly, then add with the sugar and salt to the milk diluted with water. Pour into a buttered baking dish and add a sprinkling of nutmeg. Set the dish in a pan of hot water and bake three hours in a slow oven (300° F.) stirring several times the first hour to prevent the rice from setting to the bottom.
