BODIES RECOVERED.—The bodies of Captain William McRae and William McLeod whose regrettable death by drowning occurred on the previous Monday night, were recovered Saturday morning a few hundred yards above McEachern's wharf, and only a short distance from where the accident had occurred. Search for the bodies had been kept up continuously by grappling and otherwise and it was feared that the strong current might have carried them out to sea, but providentially they drifted ashore and the bereaved friends have the melancholy consolation of knowing where their beloved sleep. The bodies were interred Saturday afternoon, Captain McRae's at Canoe Cove, William McLeod's at Churchhill. Both funerals were largely attended, the bodies being buried in the city as soon after the recovery of the bodies as arrangements could be made.

The elbow joint was so badly fractured that it was found necessary to amputate the arm above the elbow. THE COLUMBUS MEETING

COLUMBUS, Ohio, July 24—The six early closing events which will be decided next week at the Columbus Midsummer Grand Circuit meeting, received one hundred and twenty one nominations, amounting to fifty six in the three trotts and sixty five in the same number of events for pacers. A few of them were declared out when the bell rings, all of the best which were paraded at Cleveland, Toledo, and Kalamazoo will be out for the world.

In the fast event for trotters, Geers will be seen behind Don de Lopez with which he defeated Mignola and Baron Cegande at Toledo in 2:05.3-4, while Murphy will start either Charles Rex or the black gelding Dr. Nick, which made his first start this season at Kalamazoo last Tuesday when he finished second to Peter June. Also if Hyde has recovered from the accident which placed him on the shelf at Toledo, he may be seen behind Wilkes Brewer.

This natty going trotter is an Ohio product and has always shown well in her race at Columbus.

The \$5,000 event for the 2.11 trotters will bring together the best field that has been seen in public this year. The list of horses eligible includes Alta Donovan and Golden Spier, the pair which made King Waits trot in 2:05.4 and 2:05.5 to win at Toledo, Norman the four year old gelding which equalled the world's record at the same meeting, E. Colorado, who should be due or a killing if Cox expects to do anything with him this year, Millie Irwin, Arion McKinney, and Alie Ashbrook.

On public form, Valentine should land the Southern Hotel Purse with Peter Coley. He took the measure of the best that are in it at Cleveland and Toledo. Still, The Toddler has an uneasy habit of flying out in front at each of the Columbus meetings and winning either a heat or race which makes everybody sit up and take notice. Last year he trotted a third heat in 2:03.4 and was the contending horse in each of the other heats that were won by Royal Mack or Wilkes Brewer. In 1918 at the Midsummer meeting, The Toddler defeated Mack Forbes and Bertha McGuire in 2:08.4. He also came back in September and won again in 2:08.4 from Wilkes Brewer.

In the matter of speed there is but very little to choose between the fields in the three pacing races. Valentine has his western crusader Red Lancelot in the 2:08 pace with Calgary Earl the selection from the Murphy brigade which includes John Henry, Wood Patch, Symbor, S. Forrest and Ethel Chimes, together with Colonel Bidwell and Hazel Kuestner. As Murphy snatched a heat from Red Lancelot at Kalamazoo with the Forrest horse in 2:01.4, he may try to catch him again with the Oklahoma bred stallion at Columbus. With
