YESTERDAY Major Stewart completed the list of applicants for 82nd Regiment for the Colonial Auxiliary Forces Long Service Medal and Victoria Decoration. It will be remembered that the Colonial Auxiliary Forces Officer's Decoration was granted by Her Late Majesty as a reward for good and long service. The letters "V. D." will be inserted in the Militia List before the name of the officer to whom the decoration is given. Twenty years commissioned service or its equivalent are required to make applicant eligible to receive the decoration. It is understood that there are some 12 members of the 82nd Regiment entitled to the Medal.
